Building Maintenance

Building Rental

Contact person for other organizations (breed/ specialty clubs etc) who are interested in renting the Club building. Works with these groups on the contract and insurance for renting the building.

<u>Bylaws</u>

Responsible for the Constitution and Bylaws interpretation and any revisions or additions the club votes to do.

CGC

Schedules, finds volunteers, and attends the CGC, CGCA, CGCU and Trick Dog tests.

Commissary

Inventory and stock supplies as needed for refrigerator, kitchen and bathroom.

Database/Roster

Updates the master database with new members, attendance, dues. Creates roster for website. Supplies files and analytics as requested. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Historian

Collects articles, letters, photographs and newspaper clippings for inclusion in the Club scrapbook and website.

Legislative Liaison

Determine if there are new state legislation or local ordinances being changed or initiated. Review animal magazines and websites for any news items on animal legislation.

Library

Maintain Club library of books and DVDs. Reviews and recommends books and/or DVDs/CDs for library acquisition.

Place advertisements in appropriate paces. Present DTCDC event information to the media. Continue to sponsor the regular obenience First Place Novice A at all Texas Kennel Club Obedience trials.

Purchasing

Purchases Club apparel, training equipment and supplies as they pertain to training.

Registration/Registrar

Responsible for reviewing the students and their dogs for each puppy and beginner class. Get and review all shot records. Make sure students have watched the registration video. Answer questions emailed to the club regarding classes. Manage Eventbrite. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Safety and Awareness

Review news, articles and science on COVID to help the board make intelligent decisions navigating COVID restrictions. Write a report for anyone that has had an accident at the club.

Show 'n Go

Responsible for scheduling SNG dates, volunteers to do run throughs, and stewards. Create and distribute announcement flyers. Oversee the day of SNG. Knowledge of Google Sheets is a plus.

Social

Plan and coordinate social gatherings for the club including a Summer Fun Day and December/Holiday Awards Celebration Banquet.

Social Media

Maintain a professional and business-like presence to promote DTCDC on current social media platforms. Knowledge of FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram, etc. required. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Sunshine

Sends appropriate cards and/or plants to members for illness, sympathy, celebration etc. Coordinate birthday gift "chances" at monthly meetings.

Technology

Manage and maintain the club's computer, Wi-Fi, VoIP, online registration, database, stereo/PA/projector & camera surveillance system. Responsible for setting up Zoom meetings for the board, general membership and committees.

Telephone

Return calls to prospective students, direct people to the website, and informs them how to register. Answers training questions asked by the public.

Therapy

Serves as a resource for club members to obtain information about the various types of therapy dog work and the various therapy dog organizations.

Training

Formulates training policies, fees, and enrollment requirements. Schedules classes, instructors and assistants. Develop and maintain class training procedures and manuals.

Treasury Review

Audits treasurers work when needed. Must have financial background.

Wall

Responsible for maintaining the interior walls of the club in a manner that positively reflects the accomplishments of the club and its members. Includes engraved wall plates as ordered by club members and assembly with supplied photo.

Website

Maintain the Club website and internal membership email list. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Training policy updates:

Missed Class Policy

Attending class for free is a benefit of membership. Entering a class prevents both members and non-members from class participation once the class limit has been reached. If a non-member cannot register revenue for the club is lost.

If a club member signs up for a class session and misses three or more classes without notifying the instructor or training director of the absence for reasonable cause (injury or illness of the person or dog) prior to class, they will not be eligible to enroll in classes the next session.

First Responder Discount Policy

First responder discounts will be limited to Law Enforcement Officers, Firefighters, EMT, and Paramedics.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP DUES

Dues for all classes of membership shall be payable in full on or before January 1 of a calendar year. A membership will be considered lapsed and automatically terminated if such member's dues remain unpaid after January 31st of each club year.

By selecting Active Individual or Active Family Membership, I agree to meet the requirements of Active Membership as outlined in Article II, Section 1 of the DTCDC Constitution and Bylaws as shown below:

For persons sixteen (16) years or older who wish to work to accomplish the objectives of DTCDC and contribute their time to the tasks necessary to further these goals. Only Active Members may vote at Club meetings. To remain an Active Member in good standing, a member should qualify yearly in one or more of the following ways:

A Note from Your Training Director



Welcome to a New Year!

You survived the holidays and it seems like eons since you last held that training lead in your hand, or washed a pair of pants that didn't have crumbles of training treats falls from the pockets. Thanksgiving and Christmas are full of excitement and activities with family and friends, now its time to build new experiences with your dog. How often do we think of the tasks that need completed and feel like they are chores and drudgeries rather than looking

forward to the fun we can have while performing those tasks? A bigger question...how often do we make our dogs feel like training for obedience is no fun and even having their nails trimmed could be less painful?

Attitude is everything. Whether it's the attitude you take into a training session, assisting or instructing a class, or serving on a committee. Yes, it takes work to make this club function. Yet we are fortunate that we have a climate-controlled building for training and a multitude of people to share in the experience. Instructing or assisting with a class takes time away from your personal training pursuits. Have you taken the time to really look into the face of that person that was struggling the first night of class and see the joy of accomplishment in their smile on the last night of class? Did you realize you helped that person achieve that success? This year I want to challenge you to find the JOY in dog training. Celebrate the small improvements and build on that success. If a session doesn't seem to be going as well as you would like, take a moment to evaluate if you have clearly communicated to your dog or students the exercise objectives...perhaps smaller steps need to be worked on before working on the whole exercise. That's the beauty of dog sports...you have the opportunity everyday or the next minute to improve on how your training is proceeding.

We often don't like to try something new or out of our comfort zone. It is those new experiences or uncomfortable places that teach us the most and grow our skills. If you have only instructed or assisted beginner classes, volunteer to assist puppy, intermediate, novice or rally. If you haven't taught or assisted a puppy or beginner class in a while, volunteer to assist one of those classes. If you have never helped with the Show N Go, volunteer to help. People there are very willing to show you what needs done. Next time you might even decide you want to sign up with your dog. You will find a renewed level of excitement stepping outside the proverbial box.

Let's have some training fun.

Tricks are for..... EVERYONE!

Remember in school when you had science, math, English, history and PE? Think of tricks class as PE – you got to take a break from books and tests. PE gave you time to exercise, wear comfortable clothes (excluding those atrocious gym suits) and try out new moves. Tricks class for dogs gives you this same opportunity. The class is relaxed and you get to pick the tricks you want to learn. You can work towards an AKC title or not. This is bonding and play-time. Dogs can learn tricks really quickly or it may take an extended period of time, breaking the training process into small steps of progress.

A sit-up may come easily for a small dog but take longer for a tall/long dog.




A bow is a trick that can be taught and/ or reinforced and named when your dog does this while stretching (good bow!)



Balancing treats on a dog's nose may be REALLY challenging, but can be accomplished with pa-

tience and practice. We'll start off with just one treat at a time.


It's easy to teach your dog to catch treats as you throw them. This trick is from <u>addictionpet.com</u> Happy training!

Ask your dog to be in a sitting position. From a short distance, throw the tasty treat to him. If your dog didn't catch the treat, immediately take it and try again. By doing this repeatedly, your dog will eventually understand that he won't be able to eat the treat unless he catches it mid-air.

If your dog successfully catches the treat, say the command word "catch," praise your dog, and give him another treat. You may also try to increase the distance between you or let him catch other soft objects like a squishy ball.
