





Maurine Pearson Receives DTCDC Lifetime Service Award and Honorary Lifetime Membership

Since its formation, three Lifetime Service Awards and Honorary Lifetime Memberships have been presented: 1980 to Lucile Tufte; 2003 to Sally Browning, 2014 to Lynda & Gary Holman.

At the February 9, 2021 Club Meeting, the fourth Lifetime Service Award and Honorary Lifetime Membership was awarded to Maurine Pearson.

For 47 years, Maurine has served the Club in many capacities and been a consistent driving force behind the Club's success. Ever since the Club's objectives were published in our first Bylaws in 1974, Maurine has been the type of member described by those objectives, and she has always kept one goal in mind: DO WHAT IS BEST FOR THE CLUB. Over the years, I have seen how giving and loving she is not only to her family but also those outside her family whom she has taken under her wing. Those would include our founder Lucile Tufte and her daughter, Kristy. Maurine and Lucile became great friends. When Lucile became sick with cancer,





Maurine was there for Lucile during her battle. When Lucile passed, Maurine adopted Kristy into her family. I have seen how many of her children's and grandchildren's friends were made to feel like part of her family. When Gary and I lost our parents and no longer had family to spend Christmas with, Maurine insisted that we become part of her family's Christmas Day gathering, which we have been blessed to do every year since then.

MAURINE'S CHILDREN WERE ALSO DTCDC MEMBERS:

Daughter, Lisa Leffingwell was 12 when she became a Junior Member in May 1975 with her Sheltie, Smokey, and thereafter with her Belgian Sheepdogs. Lisa and her dogs were on DTCDC's Junior Drill Team and DTCDC's Scent Hurdle Team. She showed her dogs in obedience and continues to show her Belgians in conformation. In 2000, 3 of her Belgians were in the top 10 obedience dogs and 2 were among the top 20 conformation dogs in the country according to Front and Finish. Lawyer Lisa, prepared the Articles of Dissolution to dissolve the Club's old corporation and prepared the Articles of Incorporation for new corporation.

Son, Todd Leffingwell was a toddler when he would walk around the club training his toy dog. In September 1986 at age 11, he became a Junior Member and trained his Belgian Sheepdog "Killer." Todd continues to be a part of Maurine's Family Membership.

Adopted Daughter, Kristy Tufte, became a member of Maurine's family in 1984 after her mom, Lucile, passed away and Maurine adopted her. On May 26, 1990, Kristi's marriage to Chris Harding was held at Maurine's home.

Niece, Rachel Maurine Pearson, began training at DTCDC as a small girl. Later she taught classes at the Club and helped out in many other Club activities. Rachel's passion was Agility, and she was extraordinarily successful. In 2014, Rachel and her Border Collie, Vixen, competed in the USDAA in California, winning many blue ribbons and trophies.

MAURINE'S DOG FAMILY:

The first dog Maurine trained with the Club was American Staffordshire Terrier, Lisa's White Rock Maggie, CD, CDX. Maurine and Maggie were in our very first Beginner Class which was held at Kiest Park in Oak Cliff.

Her subsequent dogs were:

American Staffordshire Terrier, Ch., UCD White Rock Sadie Thompson, CD, CGH, ROH (aka Register of Honor from the American Staffordshire Terrier Club, Inc.).

Belgian Sheepdog, Ch Nadia UD, CGC, ROM

American Staffordshire Terrier, U-CD Angelfire's Dream Catcher (Ginny), CD, NA, NAP, CGC, TDI. Ginny worked as a print model for ten years, appearing in Neiman-Marcus Christmas Catalog, Saks Fifth Avenue, Wal-Mart and Petco ads. 1999 DTCDC Most Improved awarded to Maurine's Ginny. Ginny appeared in 2001 Front & Finish 3rd in OA and 10th in NA.

CLUB ACTIVITIES DEVELOPED DURING MAURINE'S TERM AS AN OFFICER, DIRECTOR OR COMMITTEE CHAIR/MEMBER:

Awards of Appreciation: 1978 President Maurine Leffingwell (Pearson) presented first annual Gold Star Award to Lucile Tufte for help above and beyond call of duty. Later, this "gold star award" became our current "Awards of Appreciation."

Bonding of Treasurer, President, etc: At the September 2006 Board Meeting, discussed Treasurer be bonded. Corporate Director Maurine Pearson investigated, and the Sportsman Insurance offers a 3-year bond up to 5 board members and two signatures on checks over a certain limit. Coverage would be up to \$50,000. Corporate Board, Treasurer & President to be bonded. Per Bylaws Chair Maurine this must be written into the Bylaws, and there must be procedures for auditing the books.

Bullet Proof Vest for Duncanville Police Dog Donated by DTCDC: At the November 7, 2000 Club Meeting, President Maurine presented bulletproof vest to Duncanville Police Department's Officer Sisk and K9 Officer Azzy.

Daytime Classes: In January 1977, the Club's first daytime classes were taught by Lucile and Maurine.

Email List for Club Members: Developed during Maurine's 1999 term as President.

Gaines Medal for Good Sportsmanship: In July 1983, Maurine (DTCDC Secretary) helped draw up the guidelines to qualify for the Gaines Sportsmanship Award (now known as the DTCDC Sportsmanship Award).

Highest Average and Most Improved Awards in Obedience: The 1983 Board initiated these awards and decided upon the boxes similar to the current awards. Maurine (1983 Secretary) handled obtaining the boxes and the engraved plates to go on them. She also processed the scores to determine the Highest Average and Most Improved winners from 1983 to 2004. The awards for Rally Highest Average and Most Improved did not begin until 2009.

July Club Social/Picnic: At the April 1989 Club Meeting, Social Chair, Maurine suggested having a Club picnic for the summer meeting. On Saturday, July 8, 1989, the first July Social/Picnic/Meeting was held at the Club.

Jumping Chute Class: In July 1991 Maurine attended a Suzanne Clothier Jumping Seminar in Houston. In February 1995, members began building the Jumping Chute with Maurine's guidance, and completed it by July 1995. In August 1995 Maurine began instructing the Jumping Chute classes, which teach the dog to jump properly and rhythmically (dogs are jumped at dog's elbow height in this class). Maurine instructed the classes from 1995 to 1998 and in 2006.

Legislative Liaison re Dog Laws and Breed Specific Legislation (BSL): At the August 12, 2008 Board Meeting, Corporate Director Maurine reported City of Duncanville voted to support repeal of Texas law preventing cities from implementing Breed Specific Legislation. She suggested a Club member be appointed to represent the Club at City of Duncanville meetings in the future. It passed that the Corporate Directors and Board of Directors designate a club member that is a resident of Duncanville to represent DTCDC at City of Duncanville City Council Meetings regarding changes to dog laws. Designee will be given an official letter of representation and listed in the Roster with the other committees. Jennifer Johnson accepted appointment by the Board of Directors and Corporate Directors to serve as the Legislative Liaison for the Club.

Liability Insurance: At the June 1990 Club Meeting, liability insurance for Club discussed and Maurine will research.

Paw Print Family of the Month: During Maurine's 2000 term as President, at the March Club meeting, suggestion made to feature a Club dog each Paw Print to be chosen by lottery at Club meetings. The articles began in the May 2000 Paw Print entitled Paw Print's Featured Canine Family and is now entitled Paw Print Family. Maurine was the Paw Print Family in the April 2003 and December 2018 Paw Prints.

- <u>Historical Tidbits:</u> March 1992 Paw Print had a "Member Spotlight" featuring Maurine. Starting with the March 2000 Paw Print through August 2000, Historian Sally Browning wrote "Meet a Member" articles, and Maurine was featured in the April 2000 Paw Print.
- <u>Paw Print President's Message</u>: Maurine wrote the first President's Message article in the June 2000 Pawprint, and there's been a President Message in almost every Paw Print since then.

Responsible Pet Owners Alliance, Inc. (RPOA): In March 2000, President Maurine informed the Board and Club about RPOA, a proactive organization to analyze area animal related problems and develop programs to prevent or solve them, including lobbying against breed specific laws. In April 2000, membership to both national and San Antonio chapters of RPOA approved by Club to be completed and yearly dues paid by Treasurer. Club continues to be an RPOA member today.

Spirit Award: Maurine was Vice President when the first Spirit Award was presented to Charlotte Strom In Memory of Spirit. Maurine handled ordering the Spirit Award plaque.

Tri-Cities Shelter Silent Auction Donation: During Maurine's term as President, in April 2000 the Membership approved donation of one 8-week obedience class to Tri-Cities Shelter silent auction. A tradition that continues today.

Web Site: Club's website created during Maurine's 1999 term as President.

Yes, they all live with us. We didn't intend to have seven. they just sort of kept coming.

Sierra the chihuahua mix, is the oldest. She is actually my mom's dog who is staying with us while my mom is in San Antonio. Due to COVID, she has not returned since February last year... so Sierra stays with us.

All the other are ours. Finn the sheltie was to be my agility dog but due to a back injury, he is instead a dock diver and CAT athlete. Turns out her sale fell through. How could I say no? We now had four.

I still wanted to go back to agility and so we went to looked at the puppies. I was going to only look at the females, but they were all too shy. Then there was this silly little boy playing at my feet, begging to be taken home, whose sale had also fallen through... Again, how could I say no? Then there were five.

We were determined to stay at five, but Tris had her litter last year. She was only to have one litter and there was a very spunky girl in the group...

Need a new trick to teach your dog?

Here's another fun (and perhaps useful) trick to try this month! It's from rd.com Happy training,

Chill

Dog tricks that help your dog chill? Yes, please.

Here's how:

- Start with your dog in the down position.
- Wait for any tiny head movement towards the floor.
- Immediately say "Yes!" to mark the movement, then deliver a yummy treat on the floor.
- Repeat until your dog has caught on and is deliberately lowering her head.



Over time, wait for movements that are gradually closer to the floor until your dog is consistently touching her chin on the floor. Then add a split second of duration before saying "Yes!" and giving the treat. Add more and more duration until she's resting her chin on the floor.

The secret is to always offer the treat close to the floor. When you have successfully achieved the behavior, you may name it by praising, "Good chill!" (or Relax, or Calm, etc).

May your thoughts be as glad as the shamrocks. May your heart be as light as a song. May each day bring you bright, happy hours that stay with you all year long.






Marilyn Hopkins brags:

























True Story


A woman was flying from Seattle to San Francisco. Unexpectedly, the plane was diverted to Sacramento along the way.
