A Very Happy Birthday To All!



Instructor/Assistant Corner:

Some friends and I were just discussing the numerous activities that people can do with their dogs and almost all of them are available in the DFW area.

There are, of course, the more formal performance sports where we can earn titles with our dogs: Rally, Obedience, Agility, Barn Hunt, Nosework/Scent Discrimination, Dock Diving, Protection Sports, Lure Coursing, Herding, etc. Many of our members participate in one or more of these sports with their dogs.

If competition is not your forte, but you enjoy training and working with your dog, you can earn many certificates like the AKC Good Canine Citizen certificates, AKC Trick Dog titles, or American Temperament Society's Temperament Test. And AKC now has a Farm Dog certificate you can earn similar to the CGC or TT, but held in a farm setting.

There is even a sport and titles that do not require going to a trial and competing. Have you heard of the International Dog Parkour Association? If not, check out their website. You can earn titles by taking your dog various places and having them perform obstacles. Safety and your imagination are the only limits!

And, of course, one of the best activities you can do with your dog is therapy work! Giving back to the community by visiting nursing homes, hospitals, libraries, schools can be very rewarding.

I believe most of our Puppy and Beginner students have no idea all these opportunities exist. Take a minute in class or send an email each session to tell your students about all these activities they can enjoy with their dogs. The dogs will be thankful as well to be spending time with their owners and getting out of the house/yard!

We also have no control over information obtained through the Internet and cannot be held responsible for its content or accuracy. Use of the service is subject to the user's own risk. We reserve the right to remove, block, filter, or restrict by any other means any material that, in our sole discretion, may be illegal, may subject us to liability, or may violate this Policy. We may cooperate with legal authorities and/or third parties in the investigation of any suspected or alleged crime or civil wrong. Updated 2019 Rooster

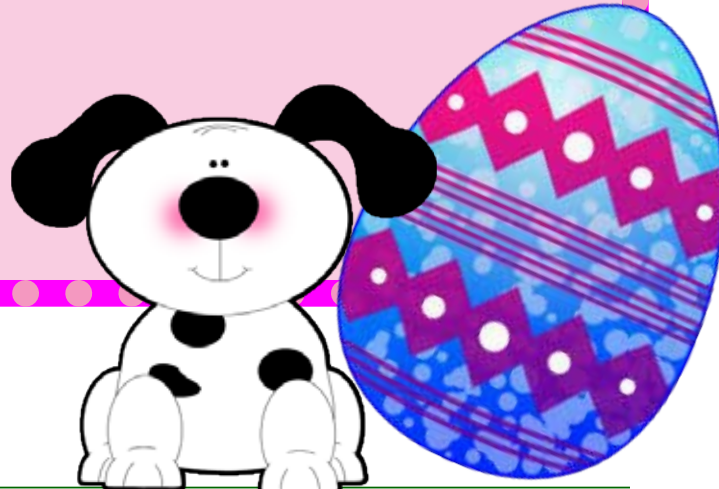
An updated 2019 roster has been uploaded to the members area of our website.

In keeping with the club's mission and in recognition of the hard work of both dog and handler, the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the canine/handler pair that has made the most progress overcoming significant training challenges. This Scholarship allows dog and handler to come back to the next session of beginner obedience classes, free of charge, to allow them both to meet their goals.

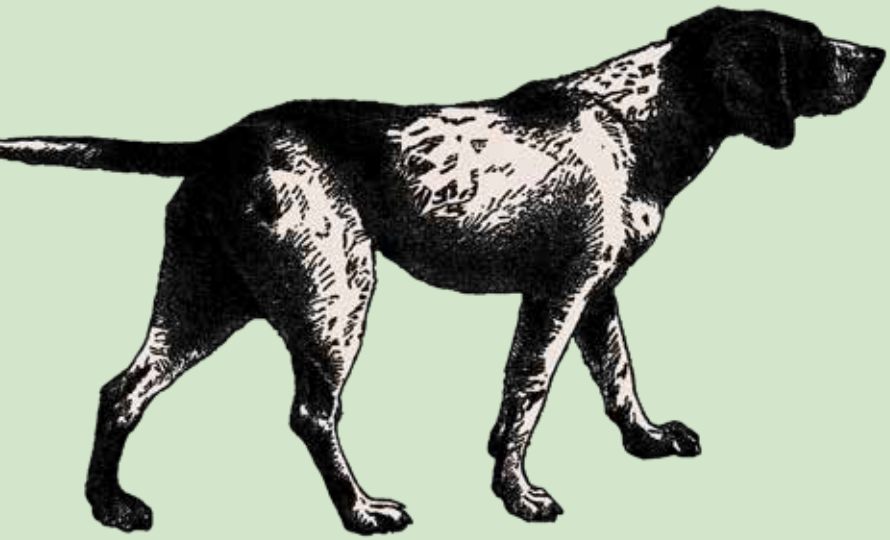

Long great three-day nosework trial over and after all of us sleeping ten straight dreamless hours here are my kiddos brags.

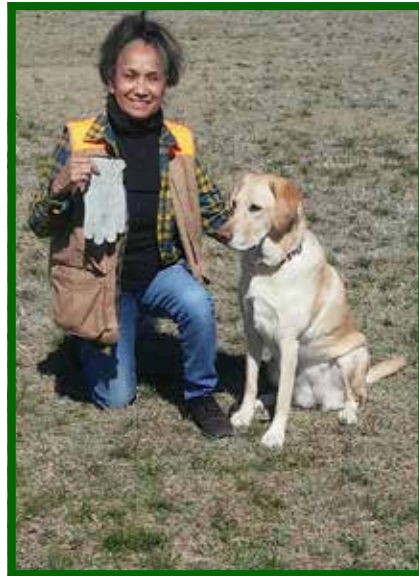
