## COVID Protocols as of February 27, 2022

1. Masks are optional.
2. Social distancing required.
3. Sign up lists, located on the clip board inside the door, are required but COVID disclosure sheets are not.
4. No more than 20 people in the building for classes.
5. The Show N Go can only have 15 people in the building at one time since most are seated behind the gates.
6. If you do not feel well, have a headache, have sniffles, a cough etc. do not come to the club until they subside and/or you get a negative PCR COVID test.


## Regardless of what protocol level

## I have COVID - now what do I do:

1. Have you been at the club in the last 7 days? If yes, then please, as soon as you know you are positive, call David Elliott, training director (214-563-6734), or Margaret Culbertson, president (214-926-4273). Let them know that you have COVID and when you were at the club - which classes you are in, maybe you were at the Show n Go, or just training by yourself what day and time. This is both for members and non-members.
2. You will be asked to stay out of the club building for 2 weeks from date of positive test to keep things easy - this means two weeks of classes.
3. We request that you call people that you have been in direct contact with, so they are aware.
4. Your spouse or any other person living in your house cannot take your spot in a class. Members of your household are asked to quarantine away from the club for the time period.
5. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Your health is your private matter and your name will be kept confidential - only known by your instructors, David and Margaret.

## What will the club do:

1. David or Margaret will contact the instructor. The instructor will be told which student and the date of his/her return. The instructor will keep the name(s) of the infected individual(s) confidential.
2. David, Margaret, or if asked the instructor will call, email and/or text every person in the class of the infected person and inform the class that there was a person in class on a specific date that has come down with COVID. A previous class or class after might be contacted. If a Shown Go, then depending on your times in the building, it will depend on who will be contacted. The infected person's name will remain confidential.
3. David or Margaret will be in telephone contact with the infected person as needed. The instructor nor anyone else will not be contacting the infected person on behalf of the club.

## The Safe Outdoor Dogs Act is Now in Effect

## A New Day for Dogs in Texas

The Safe Outdoor Dogs Act is a new law governing the restraint of outdoor dogs that went into effect on January 18, 2022. This law does not prevent pet owners from tethering dogs, rather, it protects dogs living outdoors by:

- Defining adequate shelter to protect dogs from extreme temperatures. inclement weather, and standing water
- Requiring access to drinkable water
- Requiring safe restraints (not chains!)
- Removing the previous 24 -hour waiting period so animal control or law enforcement can take immediate action when a dog's life is in danger
The SPCA of Texas is supportive of the Safe Outdoor Dogs Act and our Russell H. Perry Pet Resource Center provides pet owners with the support they need to comply with the new law. Services include building outdoor dog runs for owners so that they no longer have to restrain their dogs outdoors, offering pet food assistance, providing pet care supplies, and more.

Kate's DNA Test Results: $37.5 \%$ American Staffordshire Terrier, 37.5\% Miniature Pinscher, 25\% Parson Russell Terrier

Duncan's DNA Test Results: 50\% Chihuahua, 25\% Miniature Pinscher, $25 \%$ Breed Groups Duncan most likely related to: Terrier, Guard, Sporting

## Need a new trick to teach your dog?

Sometimes we need a refresher on a previously taught skill, rather than a new "trick." I particularly like the quote "load the cue, instead of the clicker." Enjoy...

## Teaching "Come"



## Difficulty: Moderate

## Items Needed: Clicker, Treats

If you only teach your dog one thing from this book, teach him this command - it could save your dog's life. If your dog will not always come when called, he is not safe off leash. Teaching your dog to come when called is not only valuable for your dog's safety but also makes spending time with your dog more enjoyable knowing that he will not cause trouble by running away. If you teach your dog to come when called, and practice it every day, then you will build a trusting relationship with your dog.

| Step 1: | Load the cue instead of the clicker. Here's how: <br> Go up to your dog and give the command that you will use to call the dog, then <br> treat him. For example: Say the word "here Puddles" and give him a piece of <br> bacon. Repeat multiple times during the day and each time give different treats <br> (bacon, chicken, kibble, tug game; but in addition to treats, always give praise). |
| :--- | :--- |
| Step 2: | Go across the room and give the command. "Here Puddles!" He will come to <br> you to get his treat. When he does, click and jackpot (give a large treat or sever- <br> al treats). At this point in the training go back to click treating when he comes. |
| Step 3: | Each time your dog comes to you pet his head and loop your hand under his <br> collar before you give the treat. This is to get your dog used to being held when <br> he comes to you. Dogs will pull away if they think they are being cornered into <br> something they would rather not be doing. This should be a habit for you as <br> well as the dog. |
| Step 4: | Try calling him from different rooms. <br> Step 5:Practice calling him when he is interested in something else. Vary the reward <br> each time: sometimes a treat, sometimes just praise. |

# What is a Show N Go? 

By Margaret Culbertson

Afew people have asked me what is a Show n Go. Our Show $n$ Go is an opportunity to run your dog through a course similar to what is set up at a real show. We do not judge your dog. You are allowed treats and any collar of your choice. You do not have to be planning to show your dog - you just might want an opportunity to run your dog through some exercises or you might want to see what the show would be like if you are thinking about showing in obedience.

Our Show n Go - we ask people (both members and the public) to sign up on Eventbrite. You are asked how many
 minutes. The minimum ring time is 5 minutes at $\$ 7$ and the maximum is 10 minutes at $\$ 12$ - or anything in between.
Sorry, no member discount. You are also asked which class - Beginning Novice, Novice, Open, Utility, etc. A beginning novice or novice course takes about 5 minutes. A utility course takes about 9-10 minutes. You pay for ring time. You don't have to do the exercises. You might just want to play with your dog in a ring setting. You might know you need to work on figure 8 s so you want 5 minutes of figure 8 s . That is ok - it is your time.
An example of a class - Beginner - Heel on Lead, Figure 8, Stand for Exam, Heel off (or on) Lead, Come.
We try to hold a Show n Go each month except during November and December. We hold them on a Saturday. We pick the Saturday depending on shows close to the area. We try not to conflict with those shows. It is never a set weekend, like the 2 nd or 3 rd weekend - its how it works within the local show schedule.
Volunteering for a Show n Go - we would love to have you!! We will show you what we need. For experienced dog show people, we ask that you help call the exercises - we have cheat sheets. Others, we have you steward. It is changing jump heights between runs. For utility, a volunteer will help with articles and gloves. Volunteering for 2 hours you will get the chance to see how other, possibly more advanced trainers train. I know I have learned a great deal watching others train and/or correct their dogs.
Rally Show n Go? We tried a few a few years ago. It was a lot of work creating the different course for each level of rally, setting out the signs, and changing for each level and only have 4-5 people come to the event. If there is more interest and we are guaranteed more participants, it would be worth the effort.
