

- 2. What exercises/concepts/methods would you like to see added to those classes and why?



Your dog will be prepared to enter the joys of earning a CGC and be ready to go into Rally and other fun sports. Other respected behaviorists and trainers such as Dr. Dunbar recommend this book.

Instructor/Assistant Corner:

Since I was elected to the Training Director position, I have visited a number of our classes. What I discovered is that each instructor and each assistant have their own way of presenting the material and we can all learn something new from each other. I challenge you to drop in to watch other classes this session.

When you instruct or assist a class, come early or stay late and watch part of the class before or after yours. You may find a cool new way to teach loose leash walking or a better way to explain the use of markers or even a new way to demo luring the dog. When you do, don't forget to thank that instructor or assistant and tell them you appreciate them!

DTCDC Suggestion Box

The board responds to your questions and suggestions placed in the DTCDC Suggestion Box.

The suggestions about lowering the Show N Go pricing:

The price has been lowered from \$7 for the first 5 minutes and \$1.50 for every minute afterwards to \$7 for the first 5 minutes and \$1 for each minute afterwards. This was put into place at the April show n go. We are looking for a different level in Evenbrite that does not carry such a high overhead. If we can find something then we will pass the savings on to the pricing.

The suggestion about the pre-entry 2nd runs going before the walk-in first runs:

Since all exhibitors are charged the same, the pre-entry is to help those manage their time and not be at the club too soon. We are still allowing walk-in first runs for each class to happen before 2nd runs. We suggest you sign up for your first run through Eventbrite and then when you are at the club, sign up for a second run after you see how many walk-ins happen. Remember the time your dog spends in this Show N Go environment is part of the training to get them use to the sounds and noise that may occur at a show.





Obedience Show N Go Update

I would like to say a special "thank you" to club members that have been volunteering at the DTCDC Obedience Show N Go events. The format for the event has become very streamlined and flows very smoothly. This is largely because of the members that have contributed their time to help run an efficient, friendly, supportive, and constructive training environment for exhibitors, dogs, and volunteers.

Everyone is enjoying our new clock and learning the sequence of buttons on the remote to push to make it work just "right". It is easy to see from inside and outside the ring so everyone knows just how much time they have or how long until they are in the ring. Having the run-throughs timed helps everyone to know with some certainty how to plan their time. We continue to listen to the participants and will continue to "tweek" the process.



Our match on April 14th is the largest the DTCDC has had since I became the Show N Go Chair. Our volunteers helped "run-through" over sixty-five dogs at all levels of obedience, Novice through Utility. The average time each team spent in the ring was seven minutes. Exhibitors paid entries of approximately \$550.

At the March SNG we had an exhibitor that came from Abilene who sent an email afterward saying how much he enjoyed himself. On April 14th, we met lovely Rachel with her Golden, Bullet, traveling around the country in her RV showing Bullet for his UDX and OTCH. Kay Scott met Rachel in Wichita, KS and when she heard Rachel was coming to Mesquite for the Blue Bonnet Obedience & Rally trials, Kay invited her to our Show N Go. Finally, I would like to share the email below, I received from Charlotte who showed her Great Pyrenes in Utility – yes, Utility on April 14th.

These obedience Show N Go events are a superb way of promoting the sport of obedience and our club. I am very proud of the members that contribute to their time to these events and feel you are the cream of crop when it comes to being representatives of the DTCDC.

Rally

(A description of Rally)

Rally is an event offered by multiple venues. For purposes of this article, the impressions are from American Kennel Club events. Rally is a fun way to compete with your dog(s) in an obedience style venue but where you can talk to your dog.

In lower levels you sometimes help them a little more than you can in obedience. The levels in AKC are Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, Excellent and Masters (as of November 1, 2017.)



The handler and dog perform a course of Rally signs planned or layed out by a Judge. The judge gives an initial command to proceed and the handler and dog team perform the signs as previously studied from the AKC rulebook and classes or training. The team moves at a brisk pace to cover each sign as it is to be performed (hopefully) and it is also a timed event (in case of a tiebreaker on scores).

There are 10-20 stations or signs on each course depending on the level. AKC has sign descriptions that explain exactly how each is to be performed. Each skill level builds upon the previous level until you reach the most advanced level of Masters.



There should be a sense of teamwork with the handler and dog. They should move continuously through the course. Perfect heel position is not required, but points will be lost for less than a perfect performance of each sign as stated in the rules. The teams must move from sign to sign without skipping any signs. In some levels a

sign may be repeated once, not at the Master level however. There are no loud are harsh commands. You may use

multiple commands, hand signals, one of both arms, clapping (at some levels), patting legs (at some levels, though not recommended to get in a habit of this), verbal encouragement, etc. AKC Rally is a companion sport to AKC Obedience. Both require practice and teamwork and each require skills taught in our classes.

You cannot physically correct your dog and touching them is only allowed for certain exercises. Teams are allowed to walk the course, without their dogs, prior to running with the dog. Course maps can be posted or some judges make copies enough for each exhibitor (maybe only at smaller shows these days). This gives the handler time to ask questions of the judge. Though they cannot tell you how to perform a sign, they can answer specific questions you may have about any number of other things. The judging schedule should allow a specific amount of time for the walk through for each level. A premium list will tell you the details of the event and how to enter. Watch for closing dates, entries are not accepted after the closing date and time.

If you want to find a local Rally event to watch, go to AKC.org and use their event search feature. More information can be found in the Rally Regulations at http://www.akc.org/rules/ Scroll down to find the Rally Section with Rules & Signs.

The most important part about Rally is to go out and have fun with your dog. Don't stress. Most judges are very nice. Have a plan, train your dog, and you will have Rally Success.



What About Rally?

f you haven't tried rally, you should. Its lots of fun and the dogs seem to enjoy it too! But I should warn you: it can lead to other things. You may go places you never dreamed of.

I discovered rally in 2005 when it was a new event in AKC. My husband and I were training our Sheltie, Krystal, in an obedience class. When we began the class, we had no intention of showing our dog. We just wanted a dog who behaved well at home. The class introduced us to a new event called "Rally." We thought it was great fun and Krystal did well at it. The next thing we knew we were showing her at AKC events. She quickly earned her Novice, Advanced and Excellent titles.

I wanted to continue to train, so I looked around for another place to train her. I stumbled across a training facility called "Dog Training Club of Dallas County." I signed up to take a class called "Intermediate" since we had already had novice obedience training. Our teacher was Stella Moore who encouraged me to take another class and then join the club. I'm glad I did.

You can see how one thing led to another. It began so innocently with me wanting a well-behaved dog and wound up with going to shows and earning titles in Rally and Obedience. Our little Krystal passed away on December 30, 2014 and I am now training another Sheltie, Maddie, in Rally and Obedience and plan to try other events (such as Nosework) too.

In Rally you follow a path of numbered cones, or stations, with signs which direct you to perform certain maneuvers, such as "Circle Left 360 Degrees" or "Down you Dog." Here are some sample signs:



The signs begin in Novice with simple maneuvers and proceed with signs of increasing difficulty through Advanced, Excellent and Masters. Masters is a new level which has been added recently by AKC.

Give Rally a try! It's lots of fun and DTCDC has training classes for the different Rally levels. I am now teaching the Novice Rally Class, so you see how one thing lead to another!



My experience with Rally...

「y dog Eichler and I attended our first Rally Novice class a little less then a year ago. This was my first competitive obedience endeavor. I wore Robin Quintana out that night with my loud talking, racing around the stations and chasing after her trying to get in front of her. She didn't know what to think of me. I had forgotten to tell her about my hearing problem and my hearing aides were not adjusting to the acoustics in the room. I could barely hear myself talk and could only hear her if I stood very close and stared at her lips. Once I told her about my hearing and she understood that I wasn't stalking her, she was very nice and encouraging.

Even more impressive, we went to Home Depot after the trial. A large family with several little kids surrounded us. They all took turns petting Eichler.

"Does he do any tricks?" they asked in Spanish.

My chest swelled up.

"Let me show you what this dog can do," I proudly said.

Eichler did the best Call Front Finish Right ever. 360 Left. Right Spin. Sit Down Stand. We did several more until I noticed a crowd had gathered.

"Wow. How did you teach him all that?" they asked.

"I love my dog. I take very good care of him. And, I joined a dog training club," I told them.

They ran off. Hopefully, to get their dog from the back yard and start training him.

Thank you to all our club members. Thank you for taking such good care of our facility. Thank you for the great administrative work. Thank you for the training and leadership. And thank you to all those special classmates that make this so much fun.


Winners of the 2017 Most Improved Rally Score and Highest Average Rally Score Awards were not able to be at our 2017 Annual Awards Banquet







Debbie Higgins is a human dental hygienist who also cleans dogs' teeth the same way she cleans ours – without anesthesia. I have used her as have others at our club. She must have a bit of magic in her because the dogs literally lay there and allow her to clean their teeth. She has cleaned the teeth of a German Shepherd, Belgian Sheepdog, Whippets and a Miniature Schnauzer for club members.
