Training Committee News

Thanks to Caroline Oldham for the great mini seminar on marker training! She added to our knowledge of markers, introduced the clicker as a marker, and taught us how to get behavior to mark and reinforce by capturing, luring, or shaping the behavior. Kudos to our working spot students who did a great job!

The seminar brought up questions about our club clicker policy, so I am re-publishing the policy here. If any of you have any questions, feel free to contact me:

Allowing the use of clickers by students who are already familiar with and using a clicker will be at the instructor's discretion with the following guidelines:

Only instructors knowledgeable and experienced with clickers should allow their use in their class since the instructor would then be expected to monitor the students' proper use and timing. Instructors who are not clicker trainers cannot be expected to do this.

Clicker Trainers, please be respectful to the instructor and other participants as to not disrupt class with the clickers. Follow the instructor's directions.

Ever looking onward, our next training opportunity will be June 29th, 1 – 5 p.m., when behavior consultant Karen Deeds will be at our club to instruct us in how dogs communicate with each other and with us. I have seen this seminar and recommend it for all instructors and assistants. As, always, if you are attending and have not already done so, please RSVP me. See you there!

Instructor/Assistant Corner:

Did you know that dogs form emotional responses to people, places, objects, actions? They can “like” their toy, “fear” the vet’s office, experience “anxiety” when you are preparing to leave the house.

These can be very powerful attachments and can become stronger each time the dog experiences the people, place, or object. Every visit to the vet can cause the dog to become more and more fearful because each visit tends to reinforce the dog’s expectation that something bad or painful is going to happen there.

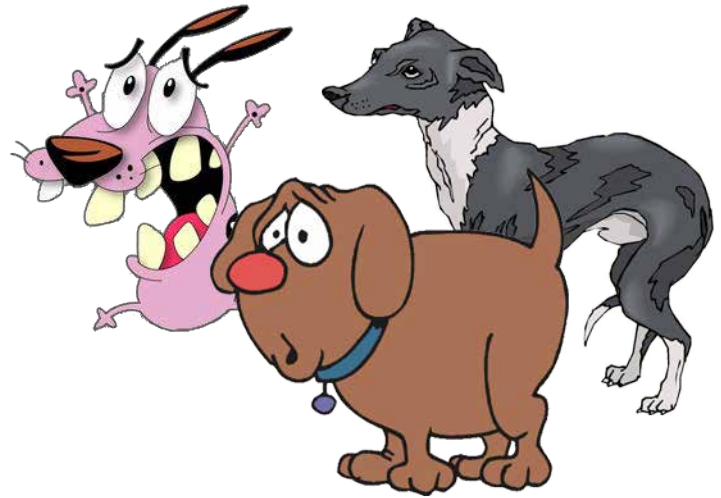
First experiences are critical since that first experience will determine what emotion the dog has in the future. This is why it is recommended you take your puppy to the vet and just have a good time and leave the very first visit. The dog now has a positive emotional response to the vet office and will actual be less likely to form a fearful reaction to the vet in the future.

This emotional response in dogs can be used to change their current emotional connections as well. Does your dog get anxious when he sees you putting on your shoes, getting a coat, jangling your keys because he knows you are about the leave him? Change that response to shoes, coat, and keys by regularly putting on your shoes, getting your coat and keys but NOT leaving the house but playing with the dog instead.

Questions about a dog’s emotional responses are common from our students. You can help them change the dog’s emotional responses by understanding this concept.

Two-Ball Sadie, the Tennis Ball Fanatic, and Her Experience with Flyball

Back in 2003 I was asking around about Flyball as my young golden retriever, Sadie, aka Princess, Lady Sadie, Two Balls Sadie, was a total fanatic about tennis balls and could retrieve two at a time while swimming. She would chase one for hours. I do not know if the climate for Flyball has evolved differently from back then or if we just got hooked up with the incorrect person for us and Sadie.

The lady had a senior golden female called Momma and Momma was a flyball fanatic. I was told to feel Momma's rib area and she was actually bone thin. As we only wanted a place to have fun with tennis balls and our dog and were not looking to compete, it turned out we were of no interest to this lady or her team and we had no interest in them. So we loaded Sadie back in the car. So ended our flyball adventure. We came home to swim with tennis balls.

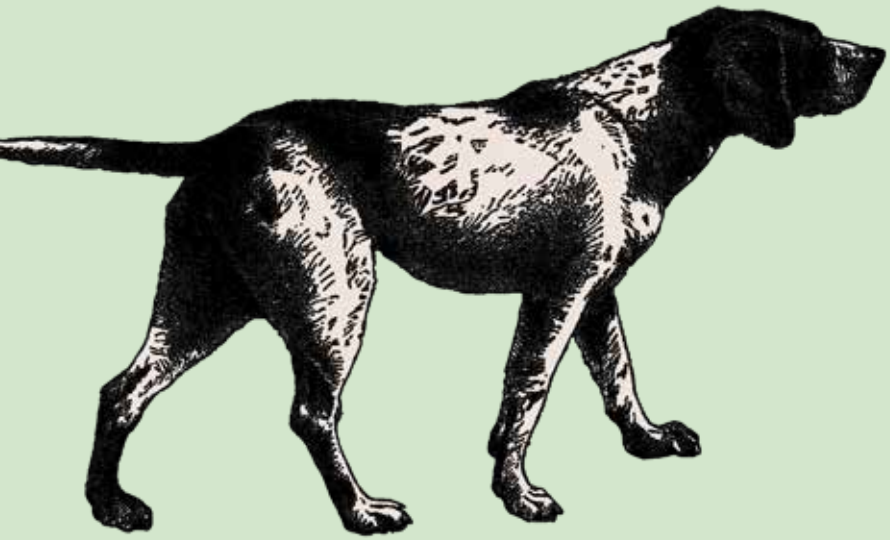
Chair leg rubber tips

Donna Heishman explained the WiFi Policy. Invited members to serve at the PetExpo. She also announced her new committee members for Community Events/Public Relations Committee.

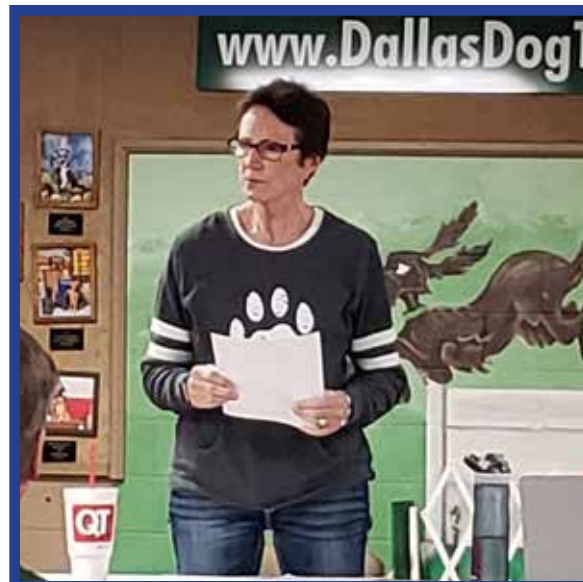


Jan Hitchborn discussed Texas HB 3806 Year 2019 and Texas HB 921 Year 2019 and their repercussions.
