A Word from Our President

From a recently published article by Cushman & Wakefield (a global commercial real estate firm), DFW's population set a new high of 7.8 million residents in March 2021 with 110,649 new residents since the beginning of the pandemic. Putting that in perspective that is 5 times the size of the town I grew up in (Duncan, Oklahoma).

Why is that relevant to a dog club? The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) states that the overall pet population of the United States is around 77 million dogs and 58 million cats. From spots.com: 63.4 million or 53% of American households own dogs. 42.7 million or 35.7% of households own cats. Most dog-owning households have one dog (unless they are part of DTCCDC where many of us have 2, 3, 4.....). Most cat-owning households have two cats.

Let's assume that many of the 110,649 new residents were families, so reduce it conservatively to 25,000 households. Now take 53% of that which comes to 13,250 dogs added to the DFW area in the past 13 months. Wow! How many of those new residents would like to have a place to train their dogs? Even if it's only 5%, that's over 600 dogs. Again, WOW!

I am not suggesting that we try and accommodate this, but with the DFW area beginning to head back towards the norm and the club opening its classes to non-members, we should have more opportunities to reach out and tell people about DTCCDC. To be able to offer more classes and meet the potential demand, we have to have trainers. I encourage each of you to think about all that you know about dogs and why you originally joined a dog club. Both those thoughts involve training. WE need YOU, your time and your expertise. Many of those new residents to DFW may need a place to train. Share DTCCDC and share yourself.

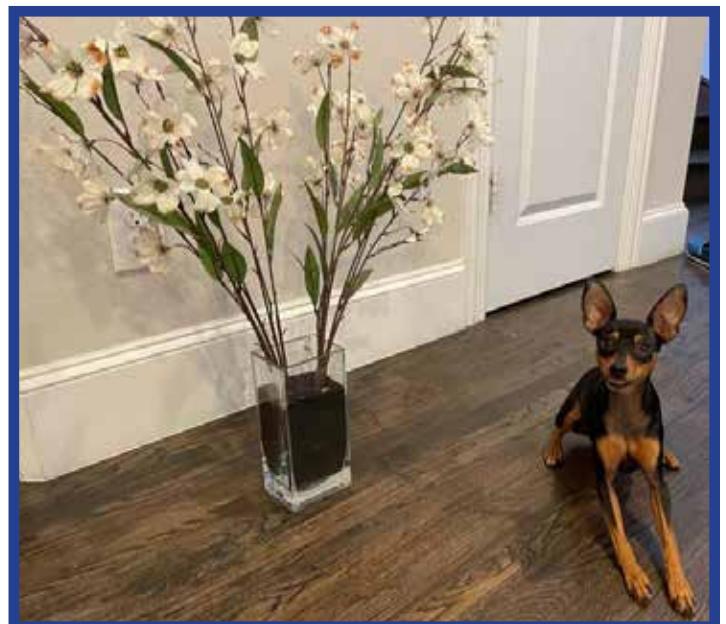

Teach Your Dog to Learn Names

Difficulty: Moderate

Items Needed: Clicker, Treats

Dogs are a lot smarter than we give them credit for and can learn the names of all sorts of things. A border collie named Chaser currently holds the record for the largest dog vocabulary, having learned the names of over 1000 different toys and items. Dog's aren't limited to objects, they can learn the names of people and other pets as well. Wouldn't it be nice if your dog knew your kids' names? You can teach your dog the names of all his toys, the remote, or a place like his kennel or the living room.



Step 1:	Have your dog touch your hand and click treat.
Step 2:	Hold the object in your hand and say touch. Click treat when he touches the object not when he touches your hand.
Step 3:	Call the object by its name (tug, squeaky, bunny, etc.) just as he touches it. Click and treat.
Step 4:	Repeat 5 times.
Step 5:	Hold the object and say its name and click and treat when he touches it.
Step 6:	For teaching the names of people (Bob, Joe, Dad, Mom, etc.) and places (Bed, corner, kennel, etc.) use the training stick to introduce the person or place.

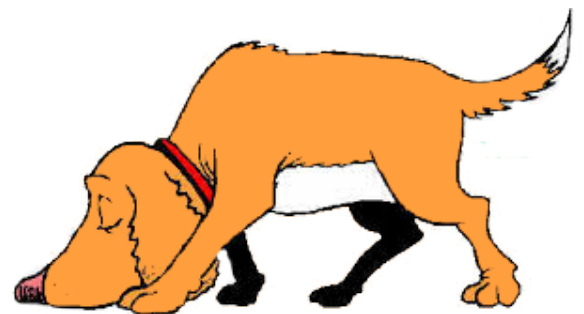


Nosework, Session 2
