It is so exciting seeing the world get back to normal. Walking into a store and seeing people's faces smiling back at me. One can appreciate the little things!


As with the world, the club too is getting back to normal. Full classes, all day Show and Go's,



# Dakota Payne-Tettamant 2008-2022

It is with deep sadness **⊥**and broken hearts that we announce that Dakota, our 14-year-old beloved little girl, crossed the Rainbow Bridge on Friday, April 1, at about 9:15 a.m. She had been battling kidney issues since December. Her condition took a turn for the worst this week when after 3 days of trips back and forth to the vet for meds and IV fluids she quit eating and it was clear that the best and last thing we

could do for her was to be with her while she peacefully crossed The Bridge to wait until we can be together again.

Dakota had a rough start to life when she was dumped in a gutter at only 4 weeks old with her sister and brother. We found her on Petfinder at the Rowlett Animal Shelter and she rescued us when she was just 5 weeks old. Her first year was plagued by almost constant urinary infections, a bladder stone, microvascular liver disease, a sublaxed shoulder, and critical weight loss. We lived in fear we were going to lose her before she was a year old. During that first year we were also adopted by Brindle just 3 months after Dakota. With the assistance of many friends and medical professionals Dakota was able to overcome her medical challenges and was able to live a good life. She loved car rides, day care, physical therapy and even the vet. After having to be confined indoors most of her first year of life she always loved the outdoors. She loved going for daily walks with her dad, but most of all she loved HER backyard - it was where she thrived. She would spend hours laying under the trees, chasing the squirrels and just enjoying life. Dakota loved life except for rain, lightning, and thunderstorms during which she panicked and had to be held no matter what time of day or night.

Dakota attended many training classes at the Dog Training Club of Dallas County, Canine Connection and various other places with her sister



We are so thankful that she shared her time here with us and just hope she knew how much we

Brindle. When we found Dog Scouts a whole new world of fun was opened. Dakota was a Dog Scout for 13 years. She loved going to meetings, attending minicamp, and working on badges. Dakota was really smart. She earned her CGC and Dog Scout Titles and numerous badges including Shaping, All Dog Band, Travel Safety, First Aid, Rally Obedience 1, Geocaching 1, Manners, Tricks and many others.

Dakota was a special dog with whom we had a special bond. She had a beautiful spirit and loved everyone. We came so close to losing her during her first year we knew from the very beginning that every moment we had with her was a moment to be cherished and we never forgot it.




















DVD — The Shape of Bow Wow: Shaping Behaviors and Adding Clues

Have you ever wanted to know how clicker training works? Do you want to be able to learn how to work more closely with your dog? This is the video to watch. The show clearly outlines the fun you can have with your dog as you learn together. This 55-minute DVD gives

the viewer training in using clickers to shape your dog's behavior.

"Shaping" is a positive reinforcement training technique where a goal behavior is broken down into small steps, and then taught one step at a time, so your dog is successful and motivated through the whole process. It can also motivate you!

# Teaching Your Dog "Take It"



**Difficulty:** Easy **Prerequisite:** Touch

**Items Needed:** Clicker, Treats, Dog Toy

Congratulations! Your dog should be behaving very well now, having mastered the basics (basic, yes, but tricks #1-10 are the most important things your dog can learn). Now, let's work on training your dog to properly interact with the world around him. One of the great things about dogs is their ability to help others, and being able to pick up dropped items or other objects is a very practical thing for dogs to do. In fact, assistance dogs are trained to do this very thing. Whether or not that is your goal, teaching your dog take it, is a very beneficial trick

which we will build off of later on.

Step 1:	Get one of your dog's favorite toys and set it on the ground. Wait for him to pick it up in
	his mouth. Click and treat.
Step 2:	Repeat this several times. When he starts picking up the toy without hesitation, start us-
	ing the command take it when you click and treat.
Step 3:	After a few times of that, see if he will pick it up at your command!
Step 4:	See how many objects he'll pick up! Point to the sock and say, take it. Click and treat.
	Point to the remote and say take it, etc.

#### **OUR EXPERIENCE**

It wasn't hard to teach Caspian take it. I set down a toy he really loves, and waited to see what he would do. He looked around to figure out what was going on, and saw the toy there. He bent down to chew on it and I clicked and treated. I did this again, each time waiting a bit longer to teach him that I wanted him to keep it in his mouth until I clicked. After a while I started using the command take it when he got it right.

#### **TEACHING TROUBLE**

He gets frustrated and won't pick it up!

Believe it or not, he may be getting frustrated because you are! Do your best to be patient and don't say anything. If your dog growls, ignore him. He'll eventually get it. If you need to, click for any behavior that is not quite but close to what you want (i.e., if he goes near the object or touches it). After that, you can eventually shape it into the behavior you want.

Tip: "Teaching your dog Take it now will pave the way for many great tricks later on!"


