their owners, ours are all on the left healing nicely. We've got great trained dogs!



A Note from Your Training Director WHAT WE DON'T SEE



April 14, 1912, RMS Titanic scraped what appeared to be a small iceberg and sank.

What does this have to do with dog training you might be asking yourself. The majority of an iceberg resides below the water's surface hiding the magnitude of its size. Likewise, the majority of dog training is done away from sight. The repetitions, the small steps to perfect a singular aspect of an exercise, the hours researching and studying a better way to teach an exercise, the travel time to matches for those precious few minutes of ring time in a different location, the time spent exercising

the dog to

keep them fit, the daily brushing and nail trims, researching diets for the proper fuel to energize the dog. These are all elements that go into the performance ultimately viewed in the obedience, rally, agility, conformation, or multitude of other dog sport performances.

That sounds like an exhausting amount of work! So, what do you get out of that work besides a title and ribbon if you are successful at an event? Your bank account will most definitely be lighter. You will have less time on weekends to relax. You will have to commit your time and energy to training your dog. Is a ribbon and title worth all that work? I'm going to go on a limb and say yes, it is worth every second and penny spent. You



get something more valuable than a title and ribbon. You get a bond with a dog that will be etched in your heart and soul for the rest of your life.

As you are thinking about your goals, I urge each of you not to set your goals so low that they can be easily achieved. Use those easily achieved goals as stepping stones to the larger goal. Set goals that push you and seem unattainable. Those larger goals help you grow not only as a trainer but as a person.

AGGRESSIVE DOG POLICY:



If a dog is determined to be aggressive or a danger in class it will be required to wear a muzzle in order to continue classes or be on club premises. If the dog continues to be a disruption it will be asked to leave the class and club premises.

Aggressive behavior includes but is not limited to lunging, barking, or growling at humans or dogs, and any bite. Any bite of human or dog will be reported immediately to the Training Director and an Incident Report completed by the instructor to include details of the incident (details should include all activity happening in the vicinity at the time of aggression), names, phone numbers and emails of persons witnessing the behavior. Description of any injuries and related treatment provid-

ed should also be included in the report. A statement should be obtained from the handler of dog involved and those witnessing the incident. These statements should be submitted to the Training Director within 24 hours.

Any dog-on-dog aggression where there is physical injury should be reported immediately to the Training Director and an Incident Report completed by the instructor. The report should include the same information as above for human injury.

Any dog-on-dog aggression where there is no physical injury should have an incident report completed by the instructor with name of handler/dog team, the dog victim, and witness names and contact information. The report should include the same information as above for human injury.

After a report is filed with the Training Director, the Training Committee will hold a special meeting to review the reports filed and determine if the dog can be safely returned to class wearing a muzzle. If the dog continues to bark/growl in a manner to sufficiently impede class instruction the dog will be removed and referred for private class instruction. Should the handler/dog team complete private instruction and achieve behavior modification it will be evaluated for re-entry to classes. A statement from the private instructor will be required detailing the steps taken to achieve the acceptable behavior and that the dog is proficient at the acceptable behavior.

Should a dog be required to wear a muzzle to attend class and is no longer disruptive, the handler/ dog team will be allowed to continue in class. The handler is encouraged to seek assistance from other members or private instruction to train through the issues causing the behavior so the dog is no longer pushed to aggression threshold and is able to train in class without a muzzle. The handler must supply the training committee with information on the training duration and methods used to achieve the behavior modification.

Should a muzzled dog be training in a class that performs a retrieve exercise, the muzzle may be removed for that particular exercise while no other handler/dog teams are on the training floor. The muzzle must be reapplied.

DOG TRAINING CLUB OF DALLAS COUNTY, INC. CLASS FEE SCHEDULE (Effective April 1, 2023)

<u>Participants are required to complete a Class Application/Registration Form and provide</u> proof of required vaccinations for all classes.

SIX (6) WEEK FORMAT (the Club training fees are for "the individual dog"):

\$110 for 6-week class: Non-member **OR** Club member training a Non-member's dog

\$55 for Non-member training a Club member's dog [1/2 fee]

No Charge Club member training his/her foster/rescue dog that may ultimately be placed with a new owner. Club member training dog owned or co-owned by a Club member.

REPEAT COURSES:

A handler may retake a Puppy or Beginner class at the discretion of the Instructor and Training Director/Committee. If applicable, the Training Director/Committee may decide to offer the repeated course at a discounted pro-rated price based on prior paid classes missed. This is for situations such as bitches coming into season or family/work situations that result in the inability of the student to attend classes.

REFUNDS:

Refunds are not given as a general rule. However, if there are extenuating circumstances, a refund may be approved by the Training Director. For example, if an instructor dismisses a dog at the first class, a request is made by a student, bitches coming into season, or family/work situations that result in the inability of the student to attend classes. Instructors must refer all refund requests to the Training Director for a decision.

TRANSFERS:

If a dog changes owner before completing a class, the original owner may transfer the right to complete the class to the new owner. The original owner would not be entitled to any fee reduction on a new dog they wish to train.

DROP-IN STUDENTS:

For drop-in students: a **by-the-class** rate will be \$20.00 per class and payment is to be collected at the beginning of each class by the Instructor. By-the-class rate will apply to Conformation, Advanced Open and Utility classes unless otherwise approved by the Training Director. A student who has attended 12 drop-in classes that does not wish to apply for membership may request to continue to pay "by-the-class" with the approval of the Training Director. Tracking payment for drop-in-students shall be kept on an attendance chart by each class Instructor. Instructors shall record the names of the student & dog and dates of payment. Instructors shall record payments & deposit monies as instructed by the Training Committee/Treasurer. Payment is due at the time the class is taken. Advanced Open and Utility classes are considered two separate classes.



Not Sure if Your Pet Is Fit or FAT?

In general, dog and cat owners should be able to feel their pet's ribs through a thin layer of fat and see a defined "waist" between the ribs and hips. "You should not be able to see all of a pet's ribs and spine," says Dr. Buisson. "And if you have to really press hard to find his ribs under fat, he's too big." Your veterinarian will be able to give you a more accurate picture of your pet's weight and health based on individual factors: however, you can check the BCS scale below to get an idea of where your pet falls on the weight spectrum:



US Congress: Proposed Breeder Restrictions

deral legislation to restrict the activities of dog breeders has been Γ re-introduced in Congress. It is labeled as commercial breeding regulations but can apply to small hobby breeders as well. This is the ani-

mal-rights supported Puppy Protection Act of 2023 (H.R. 1624). This bill was introduced in the House by Rep. Brian K. Fitzpatrick (R-PA1) and was referred to the House Committee on Agriculture on 3-17-23.

The Puppy Protection Act was introduced in each of the last two Congresses. Animal rights groups obtained more than 200 sponsors for the bill, vastly over-representing support for the bill which increases the likelihood of passage of the bill this year.

Puppy Protection Act Government Mandates Include:

- Prohibiting the breeding of a female dog:
 - 1. Unless pre-screened by a veterinarian
 - 2. Based arbitrarily on the age and size of the dog
 - 3. If it would produce more than two litters in an 18 month period

There are many other requirements in this legislation that dictate such things as housing with unfettered access to outdoor exercise areas from indoor enclosures, mandated temperatures in enclosures, mandated dental and medical care, mandates on food, and mandates on meaningful socialization with humans and other dogs for specified times each day.

This is all a one-size-fits-all type of legislation (which although it has some reasonable generalizations), does ignore the broad range of breeds and types of dogs and best health and breeding practices of said dogs. Arbitrary restrictions can be expensive and undermine small hobby breeding programs.

This Legislation Applies To:

Anyone subject to USDA breeder/dealer licensing which is any dog breeder if they maintain more than 4 "breeding females." Yes, this legislation also covers cats or other small pet mammals such as hamsters, guinea pigs, etc. But, for the purposes of this article in Paw Print, it is of course of importance to club members who are hobby breeders or those thinking of becoming a breeder.

AKC Updates

Feb. 13, 2023: The AKC Board VOTED to modify the Obedience and Rally Regulations to provide instructions to judges and stewards on how to manage a dog that leaves its handler and attempts to leave the ring while competing. A judge will instruct the stewards not to reach for or grab a dog to stop it, but if the dog is not responding to its handler's commands, the judge may advise the stewards to attempt to block the dog from leaving if it is safe to do so. The dog will then be released from the ring.

Effective June 29, 2023: At the AKC November 2022 meeting, the Board of Directors VOTED to modify the AKC Rally Regulations to allow the addition of a new optional titling class named Rally Choice. Clubs may start to apply for events in this new class on April 2, 2023, for events held on or after June 29, 2023.

DTCDC Legislative Liaison Committee Update on Texas SB 876 and HB 2238

On April 24, 2023, the Texas Senate approved SB 876. The bill will require anyone that both owns 5 or more intact females and is engaged in the business of breeding those dogs for sale to secure a state license.

In discussions with the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation it has been clarified that this legislation will not impact those that simply own intact dogs, but it will regulate someone that owns five intact female dogs and breeds those dogs, if they sell just one puppy, unless they meet one of the exemptions outlined in the bill. See amended exemptions below:

- Breeding primarily for conformation purposes. Those that breed primarily for conformation purposes are not subject to licensing.
- Breeding for hunting, agriculture and for participation in other AKC events were already exempt from the law.
- An additional amendment appears to also exempt those who breed primarily for one of these purposes but do occasionally sell to a pet home.

These amendments were included because of the efforts of hobbyists from across the state that took the time to contact the sponsor and the committee in opposition.

Concerns Remain, Action Needed, Continue Contacting the House:

AKC remains concerned about the impact of this legislation on many home-based hobbyists. Please contact the House Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committee to express your concerns with SB 876. HB 2238, a nearly identical version of SB 876, is pending a referral from the House Calendars Committee for consideration on the House floor. Please continue contacting your State Representative with concerns on HB 2238. Be sure to mention you are a constituent when contacting them. You can find your state representative using this link: <u>Who Represents Me?</u>

Talking Points for HB2238:

• For many that breed in their private home, you will be required to open your private homes to inspections when applying for a license and at least every 18 months thereafter.

• This legislation will require you to comply with certain housing standards that were intended to regulate commercial facilities. For example, existing law requires drainage systems for facilities that house dogs.



Whisper




This trick makes it look like your dog is whispering something in your ear, which is super cute! First you practice with him to put his nose through a circle of your fingers. To do this, lure him into the right position with treats. If this works well, you bring the circular hand closer to your ear bit by bit. Remember to reward your pet with a treat each time he puts his nose through it.

Now hold your hand open to your ear and point it out to your dog. When he puts his nose to your ear, reward him

again. If this step works, build in signal words like "whisper". If your dog understands the exercise, he will hold his muzzle between your hands and your ear at the signal word.


