
# 2023 DTCDC Committees and Chairperson

The registrar also responds to general inquiries to the Club email address and handles transfers, cancellations, and promotion code tracking.

The following is policy approved in 2018 related to the acceptable treatment of dogs during training at Dog Training Club of Dallas County, Inc.

## Policy and Position Statement on Humane Dog **Training and Behavior Intervention Practices**

#### Purpose

This policy serves to govern the use of harsh or abusive methods or corrections at the Dog Training Club of Dallas County, Inc. (DTCDC) including any event held at the club or in which DTCDC members are representing or demonstrating dog training, dog sports, or behavior intervention on behalf of DTCDC. Members should keep in mind, first and foremost the objectives of

the club (Bylaws Article I. Section 2.)

The purpose of this document is to impress upon the members the importance of the public's perception of our club, club members, and instructors through our classes, events and the methods by which we train dogs. Members should consider before choosing a method or correction this test: whether a family attending a class or event for the first time would be likely to decide, after witnessing such a method or correction, that participating with or at our club is not for them. While the number of people witnessing an incident should be taken into consideration, conduct that is known to only one or two people could also be considered prejudicial to the club.

Any discipline that results from a violation of this policy will be handled according the DTCDC Bylaws Article VII and any other applicable bylaws sections or policies. Safety of humans and/or animals involved will also guide disciplinary actions.

#### Goals

The goal in instituting this policy is to protect the trust the public and peers place in DTCDC to teach desirable behaviors using science-based and reward-based methods, to develop our dog's self control and self confidence, and to develop a trusting relationship between dogs and their handlers.

#### Policy

Humane, motivational dog training methods will be used at all times in conjunction with DTCDC activities. Methods/corrections that would not be considered acceptable under this policy might include but not be limited to:

- Restricting the airway of the dog in any manner. •
- Lifting a dog by the collar, leash, or scruff (hanging the dog).
- Rolling a dog over and pinning them to the ground.
- Applying a collar or cattle prod or other device to deliver excessive electrical stimulation.
- Applying a toe or ear pinch either with the hand or with a tool of any sort.
- Striking or shaking the dog
- Any intentional and extreme use of force that results in the dog crying out in pain or fear

#### Conclusions

This policy is not meant to be all-encompassing in the description of harsh or abusive methods or corrections. DTCDC strives to promote humane training and socializing of dogs to optimize positive interactions with their owners and to build on the human-animal bond. DTCDC believes science-based methods are effective in training pets, therapy and service dogs, working dogs, and performance dogs and are the preferred methods for all DTCDC events.





# Legislative Liaison Update

National, State and Local

## Governor Abbott signs SB876 Into Law

Governor Abbot has signed SB 876 further regulating Texas dog breeders. While the new law goes into effect on September 1, 2023, someone that owns between 5 and 11 intact females will have until January 1, 2024, to come into compliance. The law will require anyone that both owns 5 or more intact females and is engaged in the business of breeding those dogs for sale to secure a state license. In discussions with the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation it has been clarified that

this legislation will not impact those that simply own intact dogs, but it will regulate someone that owns five intact female dogs and breeds those dogs, if they sell just one puppy, unless they meet one of the exemptions outlined in the bill. See amended exemptions below:

- Breeding primarily for conformation purposes. Those that breed primarily for conformation purposes are not subject to licensing.
- Breeding for hunting, agriculture and for participation in other AKC events were already exempt from the law.
- An additional amendment appears to also exempt those who breed primarily for one of these purposes but do occasionally sell to a pet home.

These amendments were included because of the efforts of hobbyists from across the state that took the time to contact the sponsor and the committee in opposition.

# **Concerns Remain, Action Needed, Continue Contacting the House:**

AKC remains concerned about the impact of this legislation on many home-based hobbyists. Please contact the House Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committee to express your concerns with SB 876. The contact information for the committee can be found at this link: <u>https://house.texas.gov/committees/committee/?committee=C350</u>

HB 2238, a nearly identical version of SB 876, is pending a referral from the House Calendars Committee for consideration on the House floor. Please continue contacting your State Representative with concerns on HB 2238. Be sure to mention you are a constituent when contacting them.

Talking Points for HB2238:

- For many that breed in their private home, you will be required to open your private homes to inspections when applying for a license and at least every 18 months thereafter.
- This legislation will require you to comply with certain housing standards that were intended to regulate commercial facilities. For example, existing law requires drainage systems for facilities that house dogs.
- You will be required to pay a licensing fee of at least \$300.



# **United Kennel Club Sports**

The United Kennel Club was founded on February 10, 1898, by Zachariah Bennett, he worked to create an emphasis on the working dog. Starting in the 1920s, the United Kennel Club (UKC), held it's first **conformation** dog shows. Those shows were the first of many more to come.



Moving to 1979, UKC officially added the sport of **Obedience**. Shortly thereafter in 1988, the first UKC Winter classic show was held. This show would soon become one of 5 yearly classics held throughout the country. Those being, the Winter Classic, Southern Classic, Midwest Classic, and Eastern Classic.

**Agility** was added in 1995. Agility is a fast paced sport consisting of a course of obstacles such as jumps and weave

poles that handlers and their dogs complete one at a time as quickly as possible.

**Weight Pull** was added in 2002. In this sport, dogs wear special harnesses designed for pulling and work to pull a weighted cart or sled a predetermined distance within 1 minute.

**Dock Jumping** was added in 2007, which consists of three main classes, Distance jumping, Vertical Jumping, and Fetch It. Distance Jumping, which measures the distance the dogs jump from the end of the dock to where the base of the dog's tail hits the water. Vertical Jumping, consists of a bumper suspended 8' away from the dock at different heights. In the Fetch It class, a bumper is suspended 4' above the water at varying distances from the dock.

**Rally** was added in 2008. Rally consists of a course of stations made up of signs for the handler and dog to complete. Unlike in Obedience, in Rally the handler is free to praise and talk to their dog freely. Runs are timed, but time is only used to determine winners of ties.

**Nosework** was added in 2015, which is modeled after the work of detection dogs. Nosework consists of dogs using their sense of smell to locate specific scents. With a wide variety of sports and a focus on the total dog, UKC has established itself as one of the leading venues for a wide range of dog sports.





# Obedience: Regional Events Qualification Requirements

The new Obedience Regional Competitions were developed to provide an additional avenue for exhibitors to qualify for the National Obedience Championship (NOC).

These competitions will not replace the current qualifying methods as outlined in the AKC Obedience Regulations for the NOC, but are intended to give exhibitors and their dogs another avenue to qualify for an invitation to compete at the NOC.

The requirements to qualify at a regional competition can be found in Chapter 8, Section 2 of the AKC Obedience Regulations but have also been listed on this page; see below.

**Please note:** In the event an exhibitor qualifies by both methods for the NOC, the traditional method (OTCH Points and/or Breed Ranking) and in one or more regional competitions, the selection process will be as follows:

- OTCH points and/or Breed Obedience Ranking will take precedent over the placement at the Regional Level.
- If a dog is selected by OTCH points and/or Breed Obedience Ranking the placement at the regional level will be awarded to the next highest scoring dog, based on points, from the affected regional competition.
- All non-qualifying (NQ) scores will be counted as zero and will be included in the cumulative score.

• Only the top scores will be listed for each event up to 20 dogs in the online results. AKC Obedience Regulations – Chapter 13 – Effective July 1, 2012

Section 2. AKC Regional Competitions. The American Kennel Club will identify yearly the events/shows to be regional qualifying events for the next year. Events will be selected based on criteria established by the American Kennel Club Companion Events Department. Regions will be based on divisions currently established by the AKC Companion Events Department. The only exception will be the division containing Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico, which will be combined as one division, with separate qualification criteria to be set. For all divisions, the top four dogs based on the qualification criteria as established by the Companion Events Department will be invited to attend the American Kennel Club National Obedience Event.

The qualification time period for regional competitors will be from December 1 to November 30 for qualification to attend the National Obedience Championship following the November 30 cut-off date.

For events to be identified as AKC Regional Obedience competitions:

- The selected division events must have obedience trials over three consecutive days. Only three consecutive obedience trials will be recognized as the regional trial. (Each division will only have one regional competition per year.)
- Previous shows for trials at the events must have a minimum of 80 plus entries (this may vary by region).
- If there are no events that meet the given requirements in a region, the Events Selection Committee can select a smaller show or allow another region to have two events.
- All clubs within a cluster or a single club hosting three consecutive trials must allow their entries to be opened to dogs listed with the AKC Canine Partners program.
- No club(s) may have breed exclusions.

\*Criteria for Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico may vary.

To qualify dogs must:

- Have a UD title prior to competing at the regional competition
- Compete in both Open B and Utility B in all three of the shows identified as an AKC regional competition
- Have a cumulative score obtained from the dog's participation in Open and Utility at the regional competition
- Be ranked from highest to lowest based on their cumulative score with 1,200 points being a perfect score
- Qualify by cumulative score as one of the top four at one regional competition for an invitation to the National Obedience Championship

Should a dog qualify for the NOC in more than one regional event, the next highest scoring dog will qualify.

- The Obedience Trial Champion (OTCH) title is often referred to as the "PhD" for dogs, and is the highest obedience honor a dog can receive.
- To obtain an OTCH title, a dog and handler team must receive 100 points by placing first, second, third or fourth in the Open B or Utility B classes and a first place in Utility B, and first place in Open B and an additional first place from either class.
- Points awarded are determined by the number of total dogs competing in the class each trial



# 2023 AKC Rally<sup>®</sup> National Championship Class Criteria

The RNC is open to all dogs, which meet the criteria below, that are 6 months of age or older that have an AKC number, PAL/ILP number, AKC Canine Partners listing number, or an identification number issued by AKC.

### The Qualifying Period for the event is December 1, 2021 – November 30, 2022.

### Dogs may only be entered in one class and must be entered at the highest level for which they are eligible.

The 2023 RNC will consist of six classes. Each Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, Excellent and Master entry will show twice, in two different rings, in the class entered. Each Rally Championship entry will show a total of four times in four different rings. The Rally Championship competition will consist of two Master courses, one Advanced course, and one Excellent course.

### **Novice Class Criteria**

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Novice (RN) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- \* At least three (3) Novice scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

### Intermediate Class Criteria

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Intermediate (RI) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- \* At least three (3) Intermediate scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

### **Advanced Class Criteria**

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Advanced (RA) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- \* At least three (3) Advanced scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

### **Excellent Class Criteria**

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Excellent (RE) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- \* At least three (3) Excellent scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

### **Master Class Criteria**

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Master (RM) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- \* At least three (3) Master scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

### Championship Class Criteria

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Advanced B.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Excellent B.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Master.
   Any of the above-listed qualifying scores may be earned singularly or in any combination.

Entries will be arranged according to the jump height of the dogs, per Chapter 1, Section 2, of the AKC Rally<sup>®</sup> Regulations.

# Need a new trick to teach your dog?



# Into the Collar

With this command, your dog will learn to put on his collar virtually by himself – a great help when you want to go for a walk! At first,



your dog must learn that the collar is harmless. Put it very big and just let him sniff it. Give him pieces of food. If he finds the collar interesting, lift one side slightly off the ground. Now your dog may eat treats that are lying on the floor in such a way that his nose has to go through the collar.

Now hold the collar in the air in front of your dog and feed him treats through the opening. If he voluntarily places his nose through it, introduce a signal word like "collar". Now hold the collar in front of his nose, give him the word signal, and praise your dog profusely when he puts his nose

through it. Gradually pull the collar further and further over his head and gradually adjust it to the right size.
