





An Unexpected Journey

Then I think back on that weekday in early February 2013, I realize I had no idea what an amazing partnership and journey the little six-week-old white Labrador puppy and I would eventually take.

(Jan holds puppy Logan.)

Jim and I had just lost our two year old shelter rescued white Lab who had taken to my husband who was terminal with bone prostate cancer. Eleven months after rescuing Riley and many tests, he passed away with a very rare lymphoma confirmed by UCLA Davis.

(Jan poses with Riley.)

Even though we had a Golden Retriever pack including one male Golden who was smitten with Jim, Riley had been different. Long story short, in a conversation with a coworker, I found out her great recent dog came from Craig's List. (I hear the groans.) Not knowing much I googled it and after reading many profiles of many looking for homes, it became apparent we needed a puppy that could be integrated into our mainly senior pack. There was a post about two AKC



white Labrador pups going to the shelter if not adopted soon. I called. The litter of 9 pups born to white Lab sire and chocolate Bitch had arrived on New Years Eve 2012 and friends and friends of friends had spoken for the chocolate, black and brown Labs, but not the whites. I made an appointment for the next day to meet my husband there during my lunch time. Jim selected one and we whispered to each other we did not care for the surroundings and it was obvious the folks were in over their heads, so even though the pup was only six weeks old, we asked if we could take him then. They said yes and said he was weaned (ha), paid and rapidly said our thanks and left. And so, Sir Logan Riley joined our pack who took him under all their wings, mothering, sleeping with him at night and day naps, showing him how to eat and drink and my females taught him good behavior and manners.

January 2015 saw me taking our five month old Miniature Aussie, Skye Blu, to DTCDC as recommended by good friend Helen Cariotis for basic obedience. That Spring Skye and Logan rotated obe-



dience classes. I heard in late spring about a new sport sponsored by UKC - nosework/scent detection. One intro class had been taught and five members including Bob Rodriguez, Victor Borras, Danika and Holly Taylor and Benita Zapata had gone to an early trial. I got bare bones info on it, but I was not a member yet and heard no more. I joined the club in May of 2015, and in early July an inquiry went out asking would anyone be interested in a Sunday late morning class to learn about the sport. That class had myself, Jan Bajovich, Vicki Jackson, Georgann Hughes and Sandi Myers in it. (Hope I didn't overlook someone.)

Logan had become more my dog especially with obedience classes and home practice and it had become evident to all he did not favor obedience even lying down and going to sleep in intermediate class! Logan

took to nosework like the old saying "a duck does to water." I purposely worked him at home outside the kitchen area with floor to ceiling windows so Jim, who had now been in hospice for sometime and was getting weaker, could watch. Logan could not get enough and he wriggled with ex-



citement when working it. A few weeks after the class started, Jim passed away. Continuing with my classes and especially nosework took my mind off our loss.

Jan Bajovich had discovered the group Lonestar K9 Performance folks were doing Monday evening classes in nosework in Alvarado and she got the okay for Benita and me to join in - which we did in January 2016. There were no classes being offered yet at DTCDC. Lonestar already had applied and been approved to hold nosework trials and had one coming up in Spring of 2016.

I entered even though one gent, Dave Kroyer who is a big Texas promoter and trainer in the sport, told me he liked Logan a lot, but didn't feel we were ready.

Jan Hitchborn brags:

Logan and I competed in a Nosework trial weekend of January 14/15. Hosted by Lonestar K9 Performance Club in Alvarado. It was for interior and exterior searches and exterior searches were cold drizzly foggy. I had six layers on. Logan qualified in both exterior searches and both interior searches in the Superior level. Thus earning those two titles. He was the only qualifier in first Superior exterior trial. He earned three first place ribbons, one second place ribbon and three high in trial ribbons. Photo at left is from the second day which was for interior searches. I am so proud of him.

Well, money had been paid and we went and nailed everything offered (pre-trials were required then) which included exteriors and vehicles but we NQd on one vehicle which was all my fault. I was shaking like a leaf literally the first trial and was tight on leash and as they say it went down the leash. It didn't scare Logan, but we were so close he was actually worried that something was wrong with me and stopped to look at me to check and yep, I called it. Second vehicle trial I think I held my breath while holding end of lead! He worked perfectly.

Logan and I did as many local trials as we could and with Benita's growing friendship and help, we traveled to distant trials requiring overnights. (I had always been the copilot on travels with my husband.) With Logan and a cell phone I discovered I could do this and discovered this world of independent women who traveled everywhere alone or with one another. Logan was the perfect gentleman in hotels and on stops earning many titles along the way. Most of our non-qualifying runs could be laid at my feet. Victor had branched out to hold training classes and often told me he set hides to try to fool Logan but was rarely successful.

We got to know Karen Shivers who wrote the program/ rules for UKC Nosework. In the end Logan earned his EN and Championship Nosework titles under her or at one of her sponsored trials. His EN, Elite Nosework, title which in beginning was the highest, was finished at one of her trials in vehicles where Bob Rodriguez and Victor Borras were assisting.



Around this time I started Maggie in the sport while finishing Skye in rally earning 12 titles and a CD. Logan went with me to all those trials and earned his novice and advance titles in

rally just enjoying being with me. He knew there was always a nosework trial around the corner. Benita, Georgann and I took over the fledging Friday night nosework classes at the club. I had just started Skye in nosework when the pandemic happened and we had six months at home training all in nosework only. Maggie had demonstrated she was not the greatest fan of nosework which I now know was because I hadn't train her correctly for her. She was an "action Jackson" dog and in 2017 she and Logan did NADD Dock Diving. Logan soared to heights that took my breath away when I saw the photos. Logan was six now and I started hearing of dogs injuring themselves and so after that great year we left dock diving.

After lockdown, Logan, Skye and I went to nosework trials. I had gotten a Golden retriever puppy, Rookie, during Covid and so Maggie had a friend at home for those days we were gone. More local trials were being held requiring driving but not overnights. I found the "secret" of working Skye and she started soaring as well. It was during this time Logan earned his Championship title.

Now with two active nosework dogs, trials became very busy for me running two dogs. Logan earned his UKC Championship in summer 2021 with Karen Shivers. He went on to earn his Grand Championship with NTNWC in 2023 under judge Nancy Anderson who had been with Karen Shivers in earlier days. (GRAND) Skye followed in 2023 with her EN title.

(Skye awarded her EN.)

I discovered how to form a personal partnership with each dog and Logan and I even came up with a celebration routine after a successful run which he enjoys doing any time. Skye is just happy to have me recognizing she's found all and now for the big treat!

DTCDC Accomplishments in Nosework/Scentwork

The nosework group wanted to share with the club all past and current members achievements in nosework at the highest levels in AKC and UKC. UKC started having trials in 2015. At first the highest title was an Elite Nosework (EN). Around 2018 AKC launched its scent work program. As time went on UKC added a Championship title and a Grand Championship title. AKC's highest are Master title and Detective title. Both organizations have individual championship levels but in order to earn the highest overall title there are many levels to climb. An example is a dog can earn in UKC a Novice Championship and decide not to go on. In UKC for Grand Championship requires 10 qualifying runs in novice, advance, superior, master and elite (elite is unknown number of scent hides 1-4) in all levels each area in containers, interior, exterior and vehicles. AKC has Master with unknown number of scent hides as well in containers, inside, outside and buried and the highest one Detective which in its own requires 10 qualifying runs and each trial is three rooms some inside and one outside all done in each run.

For the recognition wall the club has decided to recognize UKC Champion, Grand Champion and in AKC Master and Detective. For this article focusing on this sport we want to recognize those also who have earned a UKC EN. All below are a great resource tool for anyone to use if there is an interest in the sport. All have had their personal missteps and insights to pass on. We have encouraged all club members who have trained and trialed to submit photos. Some are our club President Ruth Miles, Melissa Chojnacki, Kinnie Hardaway, Jose Rodriguez, Sergio Arciniega, as well as our current students Miriam and Kadee Ingelhart, and Rosemary Minzghor to name a few.





A video of her performance appeared on the Collie Club of America Outreach Facebook page. At this point Dakota had never competed at any scent work trial offered by AKC or UKC.

August 2022 - Dakota obtains her first novice titles in Scent Work Container (SCN) and Scent Work Interior (SIN).

February 2023 - In Burnet TX Dakota reaches her (SHDN) Scent Work Handler Discrimination Novice title

June 2023 - At the Conroe Agility Training Club Dakota got a High In Trial and a Combined High In Trial.

July 2023 - Dakota achieves her overall Scent Work Novice title (SWN) in Houston at the World Series of Dog Shows. The trial was put on by the Leonberger Club of America. As a bonus she used her scent work skills to find the rat in under 10 seconds not ever having seen a rat before!

Leading her mom Lorna Willhelm all the way (in only her second outing as handler) Dakota qualified and placed in all four events she was entered in. 

Legan my trek into Nosework with Swish back in 2015 after a seminar held at the club and subsequent classes taught by Victor Borras, Bob Rodriguez, Danika and Holly Taylor. Such began Swish's transformation from a very fearful young dog into a very confident adult







Purina Farms, Purina Event Center July 6 - 7, 2025

Dog Eligibility

The qualifying period for the event is: December 1, 2023 – November 30, 2024

This event is by invitation only. To be invited to enter the National Obedience Championship, a dog must meet one of the following criteria:

- Be ranked in the top 25 dogs across all breeds by OTCH points.
- Be ranked in the top six of its breed by OTCH points, dogs listed with the AKC Canine Partners will be considered one breed.
- If a breed has more than 30 dogs who have earned an OTCH point during the qualifying period, invitations will be sent to 10% of the total number of eligible dogs in that breed in addition to the top 6.
- Be ranked as one of the top four dogs in one of the regional qualifying competitions.
- To be eligible to be included in the final rankings in a regional qualifying event, a dog must:
- Have a UD title prior to competing at the regional competitions.
- Enter and compete in both Open B and tility B in all three of the trials held at the regional competition. Each dogs cumulative totals will determine the ranking in each region.

Should a dog qualify based on ranking in a regional event but also earn an invitation by being in the top 25 dogs or top six of its breed, the next highest scoring dog in that regional will be invited.

Purina Farms, Purina Event Center July 3 - 5, 2025

Dog Eligibility

The RNC is open to all dogs, that meet the criteria below, that are 6 months of age or older that have an AKC number, PAL/ILP number, AKC Canine Partners listing number, or an identification number issued by AKC. The Qualifying Period for this event is December 1, 2023 – November 30, 2024.

Dogs may only be entered in one class and must be entered at the highest level for which they are eligible.

Scores from the AKC Virtual Rally program are not eligible towards the class criteria.

Championship Class Criteria

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) title at any time prior to, or during, but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Advanced B.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Excellent B.
- Dogs must have earned three (3) scores of 93 or more during the qualifying period in Master.
- Any of the above-listed qualifying scores may be earned singularly or in any combination.

Master Class Criteria

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Master (RM) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- At least three (3) Master scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.
- Excellent Class Criteria
- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Excellent (RE) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- At least three (3) Excellent scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

Advanced Class Criteria

- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Advanced (RA) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- At least three (3) Advanced scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.Intermediate Class Criteria
- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Intermediate (RI) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- At least three (3) Intermediated scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

Novice Class Criteria


- Dogs must have earned a confirmed Rally Novice (RN) title at any time prior to, or during; but no later than by the end of the qualifying period.
- At least three (3) Novice scores of 93 or more earned during the qualifying period are required.

Entries will be arranged according to the jump height of the dogs, per Chapter 1, Section 2, of the AKC Rally® Regulations.





Legislative Update National, State and Local

As the 89th Texas Regular Session draws to a close, the legislative landscape for dog owners has shifted dramatically in recent weeks. With several crucial deadlines now behind us, the majority of pending bills, including many impacting dogs and

their owners, are officially off the table for this session. Yesterday marked the last opportunity for both chambers to consider bills on third reading, signaling the end of most legislative activity.

Despite a challenging environment, the American Kennel Club (AKC) remained steadfast in its advocacy for responsible dog ownership and the well-being of our canine companions. Nearly all problematic dog-related bills failed to advance out of committee or make it into law. One positive measure is now poised for the Governor's signature.

Engagement and advocacy from AKC clubs and dog owners throughout the state were instrumental in shaping these outcomes. The AKC would like to recognize the efforts of our affiliated Texas clubs and the AKC Texas Federation, the Responsible Pet Owners Alliance (RPOA), for their partnership and support.

Below is a comprehensive update on key legislation the AKC actively supported, opposed, or worked to amend during this session.

Positive Legislation

<u>Benefits for Field Trials – Senate Bill 2801 (Pending Governor's</u> <u>Signature)</u>

SB 2801 exempts individual participants in squirrel or furbearing animal field trials from the Texas hunting license requirement. On May 25, the bill was sent to Governor Greg Abbott's desk, where it awaits his signature. If signed, only the field trial organizer will be required to purchase a field trial permit covering all participants. The AKC strongly supported SB 2801, believing it could increase the number of field trials and participants, particularly those from out of state. Supportive dog owners are encouraged to urge the Governor to sign SB 2801. You can submit your opinion to the Governor HERE.

Defeated Problematic Legislation

Non-Economic Damages - House Bill 4777 (Failed)

HB 4777 would have allowed individuals to claim damages for bystander distress, mental anguish, and loss of companionship when a companion animal dies. While the AKC understands the emotional trauma of losing a pet, it opposed this bill because awarding non-economic damages could challenge the legal status of animals and increase pet care costs for all owners. AKC Government Relations staff testified in opposition to HB 4777 in committee, and the bill ultimately died without a vote.

<u>At-Large Spay and Neuter – House Bill 3777 (Failed)</u>

HB 3777 initially required mandatory spaying or neutering of any dog found at large twice in its lifetime, with limited exemptions. The AKC worked with the bill sponsor to address concerns about the impact on young, elderly, and working dogs. The substitute bill required sterilization only after a third at-large violation within a calendar year and expanded exemptions to include service, hunting, and working dogs, as well as dogs in all dog sports. Despite these improvements, the bill did not receive a hearing and failed to advance.

Dangerous Dogs - House Bill 2806 & Senate Bill 155 (Failed)

HB 2806 and SB 155 proposed broadening the definition of a "dangerous dog" and creating a misdemeanor for any dog causing "bodily injury," defined as physical pain, illness, or impairment. The AKC was concerned these bills did not distinguish between genuinely dangerous behavior and normal canine actions, potentially penalizing responsible owners. After AKC advocacy, HB 2806 was amended to remove the "bodily injury" language but ultimately died in the House. SB 155 did not advance in the Senate.

Retail Pet Sales Ban - House Bill 3458 & Senate Bill 1652 (Failed)

HB 3458 and SB 1652 would have prohibited pet stores from selling dogs sourced from breeders. The AKC opposed these bills, arguing that such bans drive sales underground, increase the trafficking of unhealthy pets, and do not address irresponsible breeding. Both bills failed to receive floor votes, and Texas lawmakers have consistently rejected retail pet sales bans session after session.

Dogs in Cars - House Bill 349 (Failed)

HB 349 would have provided liability protection for individuals who remove a domestic animal from a motor vehicle if they believed the animal was in imminent danger. The AKC expressed concerns that, without additional limits, the bill could have unintended consequences for responsible owners, such as liability if a dog acted dangerously when removed. HB 349 passed the House but failed to receive a hearing in the Senate. The AKC submitted formal concerns throughout the process.


Need a new trick to teach your dog?

This trick is from AKC.org. If you don't want to sit on the floor, the trick can be modified by sitting on the edge of a chair.

How to Teach "Under the Bridge"



To teach "under the bridge," you will sit on the floor and raise your knees into a triangle shape, then your dog will crawl under. Make sure to have treats or toys that your dog is excited about. Then, get on the floor with your dog, and raise your knees. Have your dog on one side of your body, with the treat or toy in your hand on the other side. Reach the treat or toy under your legs and let your dog sniff it.

Then, lower the treat or toy towards the ground, slowly moving under your legs. As your dog follows the treat or toy, they will lower their body and follow it under your legs. Once your dog is through your legs, praise and give them the toy or treat.

After a few repetitions, you can add a verbal cue of choice like "under" or "bridge" as they move. When your dog is consistently performing this trick, you can stop luring them under. Instead, you can just give the verbal cue, then praise and treat your dog after they go under your legs.

TERRI CLARY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In keeping with the club's mission and in recognition of the hard work of both dog and handler, the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the canine/handler pair that has made the most progress overcoming significant training challenges. This Scholarship allows dog and handler to come back to the next session of beginner obedience classes, free of charge, to allow them both to meet their goals.

Junior Scholarship

A club member has annonymously given \$1000 to start a Junior Scholarship and have this open to other members donating to keep it going. Eligible young people age 16 or younger with a GPA (Grade Point Average) of 3.0 are eligible. The student may receive it twice and will be eligible to receive help for their first year of membership in the club.
