A Note from Your Training Director



It is hard to believe that summer is almost over which means we are on the downhill side of this year. To say this has been a year for learning is an understatement. It takes a lot of people to keep this club functional, and keeping the classes operational requires the majority of the members. I genuinely appreciate the members of the training committee, Pam White, Melissa Chojnacki, and David Elliott for their constant efforts in getting instructors for classes and ideas of things to be tried. Each has different perspectives, strengths, main areas of interest, and keep the good of the club at the forethought of each decision. Additionally, to everyone that has stepped forward to instruct and/or assist classes, your efforts do not go unnoticed. You each bring a unique skill set and knowledge to each class, contributing to the club's success.

We often stay in our own lane and rarely meet others taking the express lanes or scenic routes,

which is unfortunate. This club is filled with members that have a variety of interests and training knowledge. If you ask ten people, the same question related to training you will probably get ten different answers. Does that mean that only one is right and the other nine are wrong? No, it means that those people have had different experiences and knowledge base. You can learn from all ten. Not all will be the correct answer you need at this moment, but at some point, you will utilize all the information.





I would like to encourage each of you training in rally, Nose work, therapy work, or tricks not to just take classes in those areas, but to take obedience classes to continue fine tuning your skills and building a better bond with your dog. I understand that not everyone has the ambition or desire to step into an obedience ring, but we all have the desire to enjoy time with our dogs. The experience you gain from the "cross training" will benefit you in your main area of interest. We've all seen dancers that have such a bond it seems they know what the other is thinking. Think of your training as dancing with your dog.

From the Paul Cantwell seminar, we learned that motivation is a key component to keeping your dog energized and engaged in the training process. Doing activities to keep your dog physically fit such as swimming, nature walks, tracking, field work, or herding can provide mental and physical stimulation necessary to keep your dog healthy physically and mentally balanced. Doing the same activity is not only monotonous to humans but to our dogs. During this excessive heat, providing such stimulation is challenging but be creative and you will find a way. Dogs are problem solvers, pranksters, cuddlers, and add joy to our lives. We should provide just as much to their lives.

"What Do You Do?"

- June 27, 2023





The topic for train the trainer night was "What do you do?" What do you do when you have a dog that won't stop barking? When the dog is excited and won't settle? When the handler is having trouble listening and keeping their dog out of trouble? When the dog has short legs and its difficult to keep them following a lure?

The first thing is remaining calm. Don't match the dog at a high energy level. Remain calm but resolute in the task at hand. Being harsh with an emotional dog will not help them learn. There has been a new box added to the white cubbies in the kitchen area with Train Supplies. This box contains shorter leashes students to use if they are having trouble handling a 6' leash. There are also licking mats/canned cheese/peanut butter for those dogs that are over stimulated to help redirect them during instructional talking periods. These items are property of the club and not to be taken home by the students. The licking mats should be washed to sanitize by instructor or assistant and returned to the club. To prevent dogs meeting at the back-door area, chairs should not be within 6' of the end of gates and an assistant should be stationed at the door to open/close the door so the students can maintain focus on their dog. This should eliminate a dog from jumping on a person sitting in a chair or on a dog close by. There are also new long lines for recalls and double reining a dog to aide the handler. The summary of the information will be posted on the inside door of the cabinet by front door.





Paul Cantwell Seminar



"Motivating Your Dog" - July 22, 2023

We were extremely fortunate to have Paul Cantwell (with Debbie's assistance) present information on motivating your dog to improve the training bond and solve problems with redirection and play. He presented the theory behind this method and demonstrated with Arrow what this method could produce. Several dogs were able to work on specific issues (each dog

worked on something different giving observers many solutions). It took only a few minutes for each dog to show excitement and engage with their handler, and show improved attitudes and performance. Paul showed us a wide variety of toys and props to assist in training. One website everyone needs to have is <u>leerburg.com</u> for toys, training aides, and videos.

Training should be fun for you and your dog. This motivational method can help bring the fun and energy. Thank you, Paul and Debbie, for sharing this method with the club. We are looking forward to a future opportunity to have another presentation.







Legislative Liaison Update National, State and Local

UKC Breed Standards were updated recently as follows:

EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 2023:

German Shepherd Dog

NOSE - The nose must be black.

Disgualification: Nose that is not predominantly black.

COLOR - Colors are Black, Black and Tan, Black and Red, Black

and Cream, Black and Silver; Bi-color (Black with tan markings), Sable (gray, tan, red, or silver with black tips), or pure white. Strong, rich colors are preferred. Small white marks in colored dogs on the chest or tips of the toes are permissible. Nose, lips, and eye rims must have dark pigment, regardless of coat color.

Disqualification: Panda (characterized by white markings on the muzzle, chest, legs, neck and tip of the tail), pale, washed-out colors, piebald, brindle, blue, or liver. Albinism.

The following standards have received corrections to phrasing or spelling that went into effect May 1, 2023 as well:

Alaskan Malamute, Anatolian Shepherd, Appenzeller, Black Russian Terrier, Caucasian Ovcharka, Central Asian Shepherd, Coton De Tulear, Dandie Dinmont Terrier, Dogue de Bordeaux, Kangal Dog, Keeshond, Lowchen, Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever, Papillon, Sarplaninac, and the Xoloitzcuintli

All had the following change:

DQ wording corrected to "viciousness or extreme shyness" instead of "extreme viciousness or shyness".

American Eskimo Dog

Removal of "and circus dogs," in the History section.

Belgian Shepherd Dog

The word "tall" in the Tail section was corrected to "tail."

American Kennel Club Sports

T he American Kennel Club (AKC) was founded on September 17, 1884. Soon after, the club held its first licensed conformation event. The first issue of The AKC Gazette was published in 1889, making it one of the oldest dog magazines in existence. In 2019 with the addition of the 193rd breed to the registries being the Azawakh, the AKC became the largest purebred dog registry in the world.



Starting in 1936, AKC held their first ever licensed Obedience trial, which were at that time called Obedience Tests. Originally, there was only one level of Obedience, but as the sport grew in popularity, it was divided into the three levels we know today - Novice, Open, and Utility. Throughout the development of the sport, several things have changed,

among the most notable being the removal of the out of sight stays and removing the requirement for achieving a Tracking title in order to achieve a Utility Title.

On July 11, 1994, the first ever AKC licensed Agility trial was held. The trial took place in Houston, Texas, during the Astro World Series of Dog Shows, which is now known as the Houston World Series of Dog Shows which is held annually in July. With over one million entries in Agility events each year, Agility has become one of the most popular and recognizable dog sports.

Founded in 2005, AKC Rally is a quickly growing fun sport consisting of a course of 10-20 signs that dog and handler work together to complete. Unlike some other sports Rally in unique in that you can communicate with your dog freely.

The American Kennel Club has established itself as a versatile organization, with sports catering to many different interests and abilities of dogs and their handlers. Examples of this include Trick Dog Titles, Hunting Retriever Tests, Herding Trials, and Scent Work.

- Always reward him with treats.

Now your hand serves only as a sign of something further away and your dog puts his head on different supports.


