Elections will be held at the November General Membership Meeting. See Bylaws Article VI on page 8 for more information.


## ARTICLE VI - THE CLUB YEAR, ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTIONS

## Section 1. Club Year

The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end on the thirty-first day of December.

## Section 2. Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of November at which time officers and members at large for the ensuing year shall be elected by secret written ballot from among those nominated in accordance with Section 4 of this Article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election, and each retiring officer shall turn over to his or her successor in office all properties and records related to that office within ten (10) days after the election.

## Section 3. Elections

Elections shall be by secret ballot, except when there is only one nominee for an office, and then it may be a voice vote.

## Section 4. Nominations

No person may be a candidate in a Club election who has not been nominated in advance by one of the following procedures:
A. At the August regular meeting of the Club, a Nominating Committee shall be elected by ballot. Each Active Member in good standing and in attendance will be allowed to submit five (5) names on the elective written ballot. The five (5) members receiving the highest number of votes shall serve as the Nominating Committee, with the person receiving the greatest number of votes as chair. Any tie shall be decided by a run-off ballot. A Corporate Director will be on the Committee as a non-voting advisor.
B. The Nominating Committee shall meet within ten (10) days from its election and shall nominate one (1) candidate for each office to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting in November, and shall secure the consent of each nominee. These candidates shall be published in the September Pawprint and announced at the September regular meeting of the Club.
C. Additional nominations may be made at the October regular meeting of the Club by any members in attendance provided that the person so nominated has signified in advance and in writing his or her willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one (1) position. Additional nominations, which are provided for herein, may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination from the Nominating Committee.
D. Nominations cannot be made at the Annual Meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this section.

## Dog Facts: Fun and Interesting Facts about Dogs!

## 1. Corgi is Welsh for "dwarf dog".

2. A dog's sense of smell is much stronger than ours $-10,000$ to 100,000 times as sharp. A dog has more than 220 million olfactory receptors in its nose, while humans have only 5 million.
3. All puppies are born deaf - they are not fully developed at birth.
4. Dogs have twice as many ear muscles as people and their sense of hearing is more than 10 times more accurate than that of a person.
5. After birth, puppies' eyes do not fully open until they're about 12 days old.
6. Like human babies, Chihuahuas are born with a soft spot in their skull which closes with age.
7. Dalmatian puppies are born completely white and develop their spots over time!
8. Dogs mostly sweat only from their footpads and nose.

Top 10 trick training tips found on page 33 of this month's recommended DTCDC Library resource, " 101 Dog Tricks: Step by Step Activities to Engage, Challenge and Bond with your Dog by Kyra Sundance

1. Reward with tasty treats
2. Reward while your dog is in the correct position
3. Reward immediately (no fishing in pockets)
4. Train before dinner
5. Training comes before playtime
6. End the session with your dog wanting more
7. Be consistent
8. Motivate - use your happy voice
9. Be patient -- it won't happen overnight
10. Be a fun person to be around


## \#7 Golden

Idid not grow up with a golden. When I went East to marry my second husband, Jim, he had to take on a 3 $1 / 2$ pound Pomeranian along with my two children. Almost the first thing I remember Jim pitching was "I know this young gent who just got into med school and has a young female golden retriever. He cannot take her to med school and his mom has said no more dogs!" Then he added: "Wouldn't it be a good idea to take the dog?" After meeting Sadie \#1, I gave in. Sadie \#1 stayed with good friends who had two kids on their farm in New Hampshire when Jim was transferred in 1983 to D.C. as we were renting a house with no yard etc. She had a fabulous life but knowing what I know now and having experience with big dogs, she could have gone with us.

In early 1986 we got Sadie \#2, and I was finally smitten with the breed. She was with us until 2020 and when she passed, Jim lost it big time and said never again. She had been his girl.  day, Miriam and Stephen Inglehart and daughter Kadee. Rex and Lorna Willhelm manned a table both days and did demos in nosework with Dakota both days. Mary Ann Magness and Fellow performed obedience and rally demos. Jane Palmer and Loki also did demos in obedience and rally. Sheryll Barker and Emma did a rally demo, and I was there Saturday with Logan filling in as a second in obedience and the nosework demos and then on Sunday Logan in nosework and Skye in rally and nosework. We all represented DTCDC well!
We had a lot of traffic around our table and talked to folks from all over the DFW area. Some folks were there trying to decide on what kind of dog to get and we were able to share our experiences and direct them to the various breed booths. Laughingly, as I look back we almost appeared to be a club of blue merles and collies! Jane and Mary Ann were in attendance with their blue merle aussies Loki and Fellow, Rex and Lorna were there with their collies Dakota, a smooth blue merle, Devlin a smooth blue merle, as well as Lillie a tri rough coat, and of course Skye is a mini aussie blue merle. Sheryll was also there with another collie Emma, and Logan, the lone Labrador. The dogs were mostly out

With the AKC rep's permission, we let her run the course. She said she was leaving that night for her dog's first scent trial this weekend in Oklahoma City. I asked her if she wanted me to play judge/instructor for it and she said yes. It was a level one up from what she was entered in and her dog got both hides with some handling instructions which she implemented. The crowd clapped after I had the announcer let them know who she was and wished her well. What a confidence builder for her!
Many of us had folks stop us as we walked a dog around to ask questions on training and to just meet the dogs. I encourage more of you to think about coming and playing with us next year. Come even if you are not wanting to compete, but to have a great time with the best dog you know (yours!) and have fun. Until next year...

## Need a new trick to teach your dog?

This month's trick is from Yourdogadvisor.com. It is Sit Pretty or Sit Up. Have fun! Michele Hosey

## How to Teach "Sit Pretty"



## Step 1: Reward the paw lift

With your dog in front of you, ask them to sit. Then, hold a treat directly in front of their nose. Let them sniff it, but not eat it.

Slowly raise your hand up and slightly back until their paw leaves the floor.
The moment it does, use your positive marker and give your dog a reward
Other dogs may be more hesitant to lifting both feet right away, so shaping the behavior by rewarding lifting one paw first might be easier.

TIP: If your dog gets up out of the sit, stop luring and ask them to sit again. This time, try moving your hand slower so their nose stays with t . Reward them the moment their foot comes off the ground. You may even have to reward them for slightly moving or raising a front leg and then ask for more movement with each repetition.
Continue luring and rewarding your dog for lifting their paw until they are doing it consistently with each repetition.

## Step 2: Reward the double paw lift

Once your dog has figured out that they need to lift a paw off the ground, you are going to ask them to do a little more by having them lift both front paws off the ground.
Start with your dog in a sit as you were before, then slowly raise the treat up from their nose. Once they lift their first paw, raise the treat just a little more so they have to stretch their neck and raise the second paw off the ground to get it.

## Step 3: Shape the behavior

Now you are ready to ask for a more dramatic behavior. To this point, you've been rewarding your dog the moment they lift both front paws. Now we are going to ask them to raise their paws higher.
Start as you were before and slowly lure your dog up until both feet are off the ground. Continue to lure upwards until your dog shifts their weight back slightly and their paws come up higher off the ground.
If they drop back down or jump out of the sit before you reward them, use your negative marker and try again. Make sure their nose is right up against the treat as you lure and use the treat to hold them in position.
Once your dog can successfully shift back and hold their paws up higher, then you can ask them to hold the position longer. This time, as you raise the treat up, hold it at the highest lure point for about a second before rewarding your dog. If your dog struggles with this, you may need to start with a shorter amount of time and build up slowly.
Once your dog can successfully sit back with both paws off the ground for a sustained period of time, you are ready to give this behavior a name.
