# **Active Membership Requirements:**

For persons sixteen (16) years or older who wish to work to accomplish the objectives of DTCDC and contribute their time to the tasks necessary to further these goals.

Only Active Members may vote at Club meetings. To remain an Active Member in good standing, a member should qualify yearly in one or more of the following ways:

A. Serve as chair or working member of a DTCDC committee

B. Perform tasks on behalf of DTCDC not formally assigned to a committee

C. Serve as an instructor or an assistant in DTCDC training classes

D. If elected, carry out the duties of a position on the Board

From THE DOG TRAINING CLUB OF DALLAS COUNTY, INC. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS. As Amended as of November 10, 2020. Article II, Section 1: Membership



### ARTICLE VI – THE CLUB YEAR, ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTIONS

### Section 1. Club Year

The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end on the thirty-first day of December.

#### Section 2. Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of November at which time officers and members at large for the ensuing year shall be elected by secret written ballot from among those nominated in accordance with Section 4 of this Article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election, and each retiring officer shall turn over to his or her successor in office all properties and records related to that office within ten (10) days after the election.

#### Section 3. Elections

Elections shall be by secret ballot, except when there is only one nominee for an office, and then it may be a voice vote.

#### Section 4. Nominations

No person may be a candidate in a Club election who has not been nominated in advance by one of the following procedures:

- A. At the August regular meeting of the Club, a Nominating Committee shall be elected by ballot. Each Active Member in good standing and in attendance will be allowed to submit five (5) names on the elective written ballot. The five (5) members receiving the highest number of votes shall serve as the Nominating Committee, with the person receiving the greatest number of votes as chair. Any tie shall be decided by a run-off ballot. A Corporate Director will be on the Committee as a non-voting advisor.
- B. The Nominating Committee shall meet within ten (10) days from its election and shall nominate one (1) candidate for each office to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting in November, and shall secure the consent of each nominee. These candidates shall be published in the September Pawprint and announced at the September regular meeting of the Club.
- C. Additional nominations may be made at the October regular meeting of the Club by any members in attendance provided that the person so nominated has signified in advance and in writing his or her willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one (1) position. Additional nominations, which are provided for herein, may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination from the Nominating Committee.
- D. Nominations cannot be made at the Annual Meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this section.



# **Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship Awarded**

In keeping with the club's mission and in recognition of the hard work of both dog and handler, the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the canine/ handler pair that has made the most progress overcoming significant training challenges. This Scholarship allows dog and handler to come back to the next session of beginner obedience classes, free of charge, to allow them both to meet their goals.

A bit of history for our newer members. Terri Clary was a long-time member skilled at helping dogs with issues. I remember Terri in class with her Doberman Mr. T, what a good team. When the class situation was too much for a dog to handle, the club could call Terri and she would work with the handler/dog team helping them past the difficulty and allowing them to participate in group classes. Several long-time members come to mind that were helped by Terri and went on to be excellent trainers/handlers in their own right. When we lost Terri to illness, the board at that time created the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship to honor the work she did to help dogs overcome issues and

become good canine citizens in the community. The recipients of this award needed to show handler dedication to helping their dog work through reactive issues, and training exercises outside of class even though their class participation was limited.

This session we had a team that fit this description. This handler expressed concern from the moment she enrolled in class about her dog's behavior and said she was willing to do whatever it took to help her dog. She was true to her word. Precautions were established to keep her dog and the other dogs in class safe. Together we identified the triggers and boundary limits the dog could handle. An escape plan was created in the event her threshold was exceeded to allow her time to regroup and try it again. Each week improvements were made. Fewer cooling off periods were necessary. Other dogs could be closer to her without a reaction. The joy on the student's face when a new milestone was achieved was contagious to everyone in attendance.


In appreciation to the Training Director, David Elliott, and Training Committee (Melissa Chojjnacki, Sandi Myers, Pam White) for their willingness to evaluate this team and determine they met the guidelines of the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship, it was privilege to present to Linda Jordan and Kennedy this scholarship to help them further their training and build the bond all handlers and dogs share. In the years to come, as this team is seen in public, people will notice the joy of a lady walking her dog that is well behaved not knowing the struggles and hard work they have gone through to reach that point. However, she will know and those of us that began this journey with her will know.



# Need a new trick to teach your dog?

This month's "trick" is more of a behavior than what we typically think of as an actual "trick". There are times (think medical emergencies) when our beloved pets might need to wear a muzzle. The process is sooo much easier and less traumatic for everyone, if we have pre-taught the skill! The following info is from <u>AKC.org</u>.

# Wearing a Muzzle


- 1. Let him sniff the muzzle. Give a treat. Repeat a few times.
- 2. Touch his nose with the muzzle. Treat. Repeat until he indicates that the muzzle looks interesting in a good way.
- Hold the muzzle with one hand and a treat with the other hand, so he needs to put his nose inside the muzzle to get the treat. Repeat until this step is no big deal.
- 4. Gently slip the muzzle onto his nose and give him a treat. Remove the muzzle immediately. Repeat a few times.
- 5. Put on the muzzle and fasten the buckle. Treat. Remove immediately. Repeat a few times.
- 6. Put on the muzzle, fasten it, and count slowly to five. Treat. Remove the muzzle.



7. Each time you put on the muzzle, gradually increase the time the muzzle is on. Hold his collar and give treats.



Scaredy Dog! Understanding and Rehabilitating Your Reactive Dog by Ali Brown, M.Ed., CPDT (Revised Edition)



"Scaredy Dog!" addresses reactivity in dogs. Dogs who are "reactive" will often growl or lunge at other dogs or people, can be unable to pay attention to their owner's commands or even act crazy at home when someone visits. "Reactive" dogs are behaving this way out of fear and/ or anxiety.


The book reviews basic dog behaviors and breaks down different ways to address dog behav-

ior: positive reinforcement, positive punishment, negative reinforcement, negative punishment and extinction. The author addresses environmental stimuli and stressors, dog foods, dog exercise, how to calm your dog physically and products to promote calm.


"The Right Stuff" section shows ways to manage your reactive dog with crates, leashes, long lines, fencing, tie-outs, and even your car. "The Real Stuff" section shows different reactive behaviors, explanations of these behaviors from the dog's perspective as well as management of the behaviors and training for you and your dog!


The book uses many examples of reactive dogs, training and management techniques and dog responses. At the very end of the book the author provided references and resources.

Scaredy Dog is well worth reading, either because you own a reactive dog or you teach classes that have reactive dogs in them and want to be able to offer your students expert advice for working with their reactive dogs.









The <u>Most Improved Obedience Score Award and Most Improved Rally Score Award</u> are awarded to the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn an Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year.
