A Note from Your Training Director



“You will never be the best. You will never be the most qualified. You will never have all the answers.”

Are those statements the complete opposite of what you should be getting from someone tasked with getting you inspired to train your dog, instruct, or assist a class? Absolutely. However, those might be the exact statements we need to think about. In any sport or profession there will always be someone better. In the local environment a person might be considered the best. As the scope widens to include a larger population group the probability that same person will still be considered the best or most qualified decreases. Basically, there will always be someone better.

There is another phrase: “Hard work beats talent when talent doesn’t work hard.”

So, what is the point? The point is a person that shows up and tries, even if that person makes errors or fails, is qualified for the job because they showed up. A person must be willing to admit they don’t have all the answers, and be willing to search for the answer or the person that has the answer. The process of showing up and risking failure but not giving up leads to the experience gained through hard work. Learning which method works better and builds a person’s knowledge and skill base add to expertise. As progress is made that person that initially saw themselves as not good enough for whatever task will be better than when they started because they showed up and risked failure.

This club functions because of those who chose to show up. Those who chose to defeat the fear of failing and show up for others. I want to encourage each of you to not let the fear win. If you fail, look at what you’ve learned and try again.

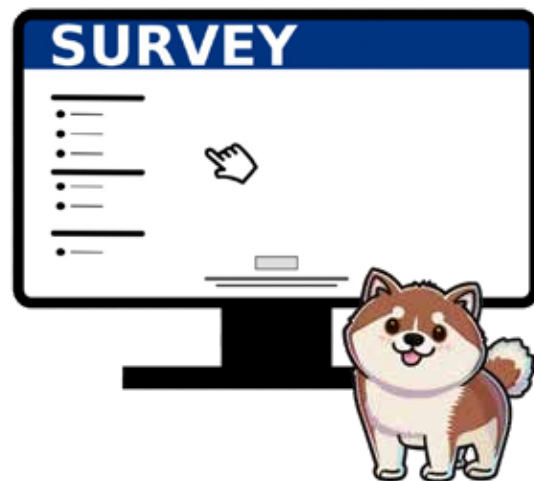

ARTICLE VI – THE CLUB YEAR, ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Club Year

The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end on the thirty-first day of December.

Section 2. Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of November at which time officers and members at large for the ensuing year shall be elected by secret written ballot from among those nominated in accordance with Section 4 of this Article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election, and each retiring officer shall turn over to his or her successor in office all properties and records related to that office within ten (10) days after the election.

Section 3. Elections

Elections shall be by secret ballot, except when there is only one nominee for an office, and then it may be a voice vote.

Section 4. Nominations

No person may be a candidate in a Club election who has not been nominated in advance by one of the following procedures:

- A. At the August regular meeting of the Club, a Nominating Committee shall be elected by ballot. Each Active Member in good standing and in attendance will be allowed to submit five (5) names on the elective written ballot. The five (5) members receiving the highest number of votes shall serve as the Nominating Committee, with the person receiving the greatest number of votes as chair. Any tie shall be decided by a run-off ballot. A Corporate Director will be on the Committee as a non-voting advisor.
- B. The Nominating Committee shall meet within ten (10) days from its election and shall nominate one (1) candidate for each office to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting in November, and shall secure the consent of each nominee. These candidates shall be published in the September Pawprint and announced at the September regular meeting of the Club.
- C. Additional nominations may be made at the October regular meeting of the Club by any members in attendance provided that the person so nominated has signified in advance and in writing his or her willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one (1) position. Additional nominations, which are provided for herein, may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination from the Nominating Committee.
- D. Nominations cannot be made at the Annual Meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this section.

Why do dog experts say not to punish a dog because they don't remember anything?

By Kerri Kershaw, written for Standard Schnauzer Club of America's publication "Pepper 'N Salt"

Why do dog experts say dogs don't associate a past offense with delayed punishment, yet they hide in the bedroom after tearing through the trash while you were out? That "guilty" behavior you're seeing is really your dog displaying what are called calming signals in response to your confrontational attitude. Some behaviors you may notice are:

- Turning the head away
- Head down
- Licking the tongue out
- Yawning
- Sniffing a spot on the floor



Your dog may sometimes lick and look away from the camera/phone when you want to take pictures. You holding the camera and staring right at him is just naturally a little uncomfortable to most dogs. They tolerate it fine, but you might have to make a noise or hold something to distract them into looking. Calming signals are how dogs prevent and resolve social issues with other animals, including you. These behaviors are how they de-escalate confrontation. Your dog is trying to calm you and make everything okay again. Not because of what he's "done" but because from a dog's perspective, you're acting very confrontational, even if you're giggling too. The dog is reacting to you in the here and

now. Punishing after the fact because you interpret his communication skills as guilt over a past action, will only cause stress in your relationship. It certainly won't keep your dog from raiding the trash in the future. Honestly, the best solution for that is a trash can with a lock, sufficient exercise, and appropriate activities to keep your dog happy and out of trouble.

The PawPrint CoverDog photo is open to everyone in the club.

Here is the criteria for submitted photos:

AKC's Community Canine & Urban CGC Titles

By Jean Villa

Many of our members have worked towards and attained the AKC CGC title. Congratulations! You have developed quite the relationship with your dog. Did you know that AKC has two additional advanced tests for the dog/handler team that will take your team to the next level? For both advanced tests, your dog must be registered or listed with AKC and hold a CGC title. While the CGC title is earned in a ring setting and situations are simulated, these advanced titles are earned in real life scenarios, and treating with food is not permitted. They are as follows:

CGCA

AKC Community Canine Test, also known as CGCA - Canine Good Citizen Advanced. This test is designed to ensure that you have a more well-behaved dog while you are out and about in the community. Here's a link to a video of a test in action: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_jiCxAeXHc8

The requirements for the CGCA test are found on page **xx**. Dogs must pass all 10 items of the test to receive the CGCA title.

CGCU

The other program/title is the CGCU (AKC Urban CGC) and tests your CGC skills in an active environment where there are cars, loud noises and fast paced distractions.

AKC Urban CGC, or CGCU, is a 10-step test of skills that demonstrates those of the CGC and beyond, including city sights and smells and noises, traffic, and crowds. Here is a link to a brochure about the CGCU test: https://images.akc.org/pdf/cgc/urban_cgc_brochure.pdf

AKC Urban CGC Test Items are found on page **xx**. Your dog must pass all 10 of these items to receive the CGCU title.

What is the difference between the two?

CGCA (AKC Community Canine) is an AKC program designed to ensure that you have a well-behaved dog while you are out and about in the community. CGCU (AKC Urban CGC) tests your CGC skills in an active environment where there are cars, loud noises and fast paced distractions.

AKC's Community Canine Test Items

Advanced Canine Good Citizen (the "CGCA" title)

To earn the CGCA title, the dog must:

1. be registered or listed with AKC (AKC number, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number) and,
2. already have a Canine Good Citizen award/title on record.

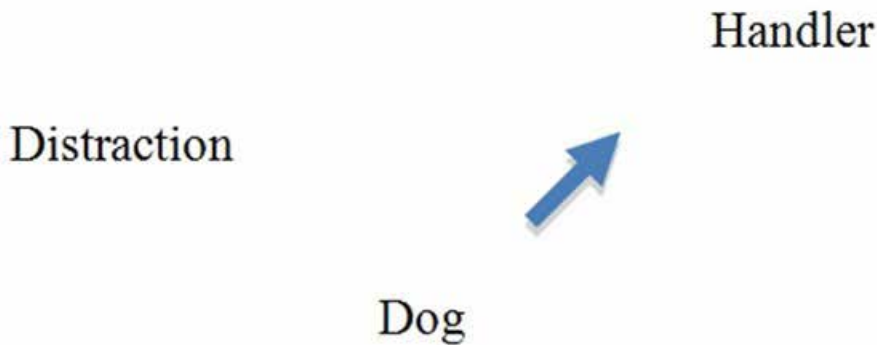
Dogs must pass all 10 items of the test to receive the CGCA title.

1. Dog stands, sits or lies down and waits under control while the owner:
 - o sits at the registration table and fills out paperwork, or,
 - o if the test is done in the community, dog waits while the owner sits and has a snack or visits with another person (e.g., at a park)
2. Walks on a loose leash in a natural situation (not in a ring) — does not pull.
 - o left turn
 - o right turn
 - o stop
 - o fast and slow pace
3. Walks on loose leash through a crowd:
 - o at a show or in class, this item is tested in a real crowd, not in a ring
 - o in the community, dog walks on sidewalk, through a crowd at a community fair, park, on a trail, through a busy hallway, etc.
4. Dog walks past distraction dogs present; does not pull.
This item may be tested along with #3 if there are dogs in the crowd, etc.
 - o at a show or class, dog walks by dogs waiting in the crowd—dogs 2 ft. apart
 - o in the community, dog walks by other dogs on a trail, sidewalk, in a hallway, etc.
5. Sit-stay in small group (two other people with dogs, total of 3 people, 3 dogs in group).
Dog allows person who is carrying something (backpack, computer bag, etc.) to approach and pet it.
6. "May I pet your dog?" (Item is placed on floor/ground before the person pets the dog)
7. "Leave it." Dog walks by food and follows owner instructions, "Leave it."
This can be food placed by the evaluator on the floor or ground in a food dish with a wire cover as in Rally.



AKC's Community Canine Test Items *(cont.)*

8. Down or sit stay — distance (owner's choice).
Dog is on 20-ft line, owner walks away with back to dog, picks up an item (e.g., backpack, training bag, clipboard, folder etc.) placed on the floor/chair/ground by the evaluator and returns to the dog.
9. Recall with distractions present (coming when called). Handler goes out 20-ft. ******(off center) and calls dog.
Dog is on the 20-ft. line from #8 above.



10. Dog will sit or stand stay (owner's choice) while owner enters/exits a doorway or narrow passageway. Owner calls dog through door when ready.
Owner may also choose to:
 - o send the dog through first and have the dog wait for the owner, or
 - o the owner may choose to have the dog go through the doorway at the owner's side.Whichever method is used, the dog must not pull the owner and must be under good control. Think of the handler having the leash in one hand and a cup of coffee in the other.
Doorway or gate can be real or simulated with ring gates, two chairs, or a natural passageway (e.g., entrance to trail) in the community.

AKC's Urban CGC Test Items

To pass the CGCU test, dogs must pass all 10 items of the test

1. Exit/enter doorway with no pulling in dog-friendly buildings. Exit building to start test, additional Public buildings items are below.
2. Walk through a crowd on a busy urban sidewalk.
 - o People come toward the dog from 1-ft. away
 - o Tolerate distractions (people wearing hats, coats, men, women, etc).
3. Appropriate reaction to city distractions. This includes movement, noises, and walking on a variety of surfaces. Examples:
 - o Noises: horns, sirens, construction noise, etc.
 - o Moving objects: skateboard, bike, carts, person running
 - o Surfaces: concrete, grass, grates, plastic tarp, wet sidewalk
4. Crossing street: Stop at corner, stand or sit to wait and cross with no pulling (on leash, with owner). Crosses street under control.
5. Ignore food on sidewalk. (Dropped food, or cups, bags, cans, in which food was wrapped).
6. Person walks up and pets the dog. May be carrying an item such as a small dog in a bag, a computer bag, etc. Person does not put the bag down to pet the dog.
7. Public Building (that is dog friendly). Walks under control in building (slick surface, carpeted floor). Down stay (3 min) in lobby or outdoor area, or waits while owner has a meal or snack.
8. Stairs, steps, or elevator under control.
 - o Steps (at least 3 – up and down)
 - o Elevator (Enters under control, exits, rides under control)
9. Housetrained for apartment, condo, city living. Owner may verify this item. Evaluator may also observe in public buildings, or have observed in training classes.
10. Transportation. Owner's choice depending on transportation needs.
 - o Car. Enters/exits, remains under control during the ride. (Crate? Seatbelt?)
 - o Subway. Small dog in bag for ride. (large dogs are not always permitted; know and abide by the Transit Policies in your area).
 - o Dog friendly (enters/exits or allows to be put in/taken out) under control.

Madison Gover shared:

My dog Harper earned her CGCU title on July 13, 2023. This marked the end of her CGC journey, but the start of another journey to become a therapy dog. Many people choose to do the CGCU at large pet friendly stores like Home Depot or Petsmart, but I wanted to do a test that was unique to my dog and would reflect our real-world adventures. She already proved to be an urban canine from potty training in an apartment setting to the Downtown Fort Worth Lights Out surveys I take her on to search for birds that hit buildings early in the morning.



I wanted her CGCU test to be a real testament to all we have done together. One of my favorite places to go is the lawn of the central library in Arlington. So we met our CGCU evaluator in the public parking garage, where Harper endured loud speed-bump noises, odd people and odd smells. The stairwell up to apartments acted as a perfect test item for #8. Random strangers passed the library, talking to Harper who reacted with a tail wag. Concrete and fake turf was stepped on. Weird art sculptures seen.

A big reason I chose the front of the Library was the K-9 monument located out front for photo ops!

The last long stay for three minutes I decided to do at a place she had never been (again, making it harder than it had to be..) Three Dog Bakery!! She did a great job, and got an AMAZING treat after!

I am huge on recommending training towards all three CGC tests for a well-rounded mannered pup you can take anywhere (pet-friendly!)

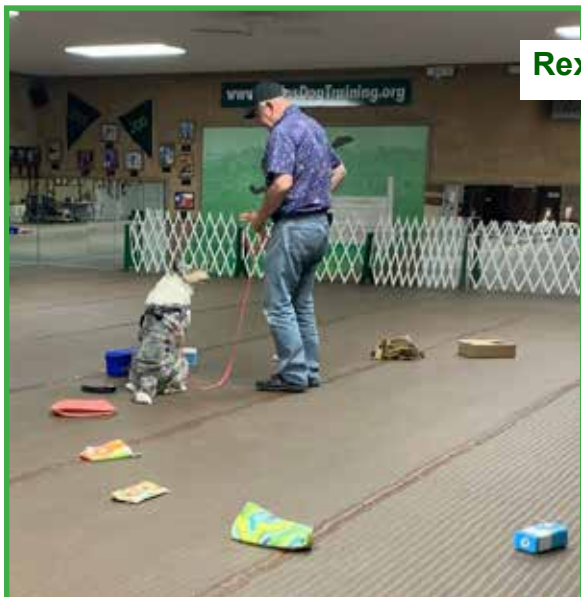

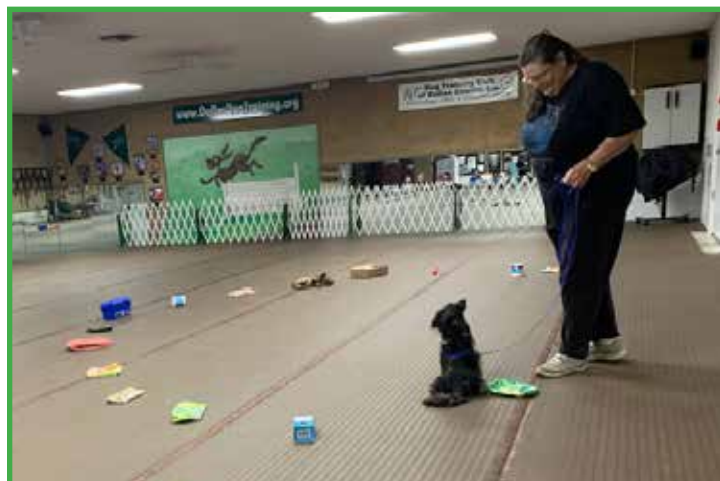

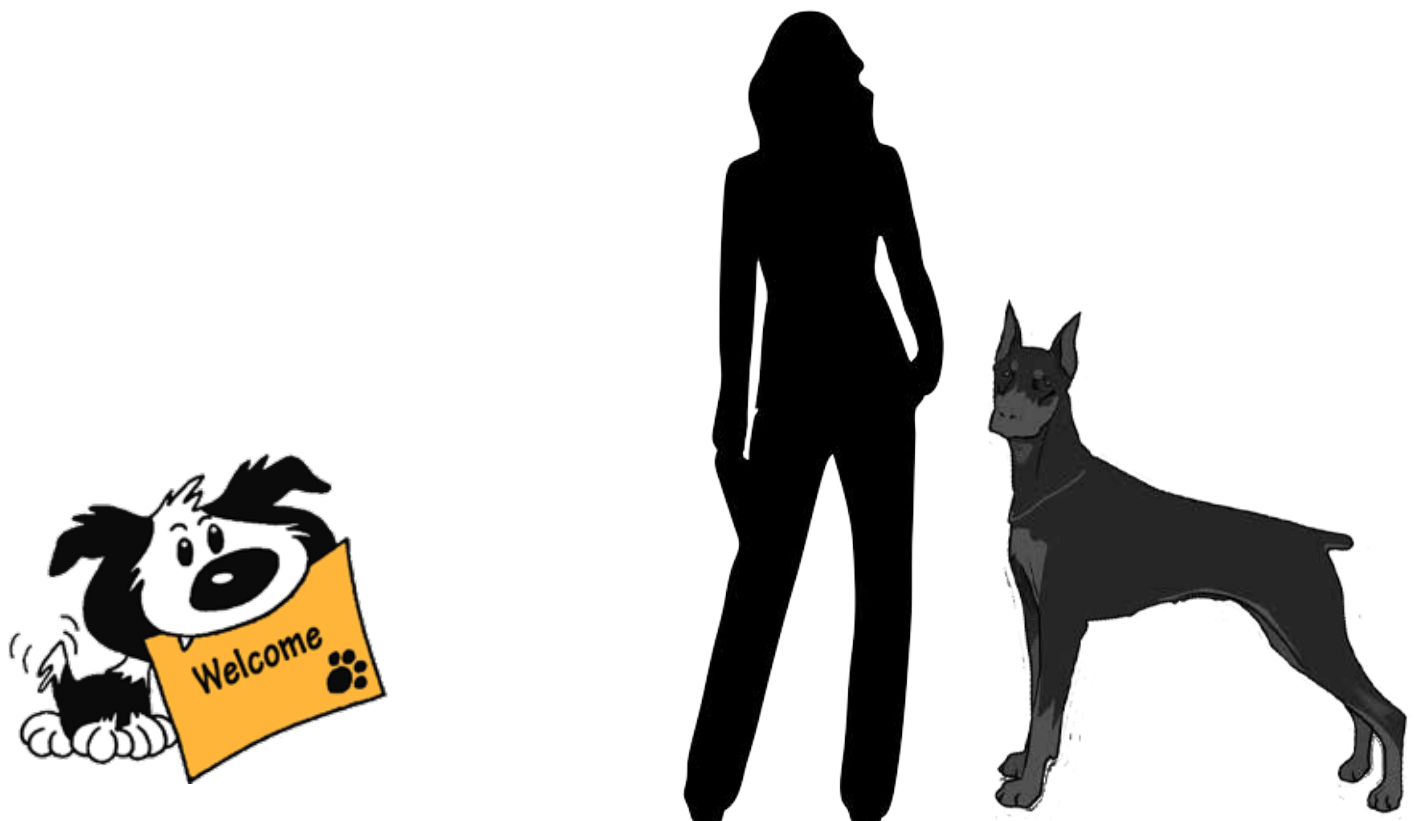

Roll Out a Yoga Mat

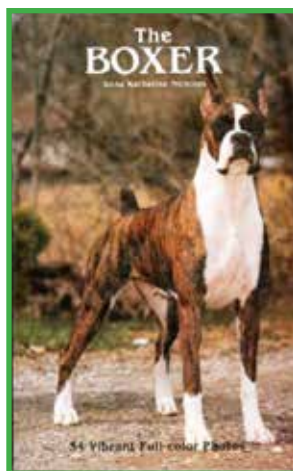


Steps

1. Have the towel or yoga mat laid out flat in front of you and then roll it up.
2. As you roll up the mat, hide a treat in each roll until it's totally rolled up except for perhaps a 5cm at the end with treats sprinkled on it.
3. Bring your dog in and allow him to explore the towel/encourage and point out the treats he can see and eat.
4. You can initially 'help' by unrolling a little bit if needed.
5. Over repetitions, have fewer and fewer treats hidden in the towel so it's a smooth roll out.
6. Add the cue 'do you want to do some yoga?' (or whatever you like.) before placing the towel down once he's confident.

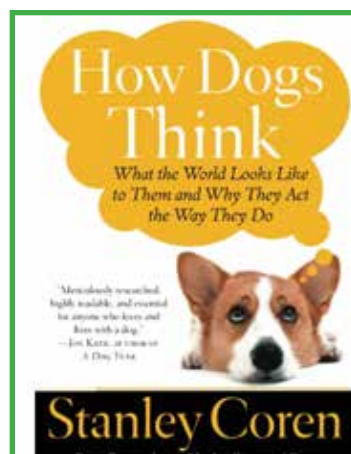

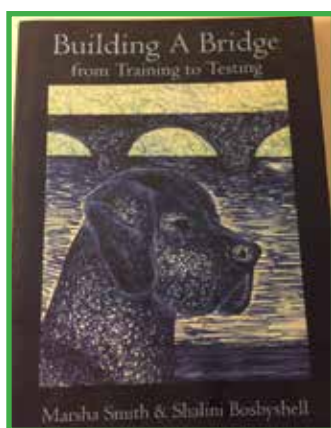

The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DT CDC.

The **Most Improved Obedience Score Award and Most Improved Rally Score Award** are awarded to the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn an Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). **To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson**, who determines which club members had the most improvement between scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DT CDC.

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR SCORES: Scores must be submitted via U.S. Mail or email to Lynda Holman **BY NOVEMBER 15, 2023**. Fill in the information on the Award Submission Form on the next page and send to Lynda. **Use a separate form for each award for which you are submitting scores.** Scores submitted are to be for each of the three legs required to earn the degree. 4th legs do not count. The first 2 legs of the degree can be received at any prior time, but the 3rd leg that earned the degree must be received during the period November 15, 2022 to November 14, 2023. Highest Average is an average of the legs that earned the title. Most Improved must be points between 1st and 2nd, 2nd and 3rd, or 1st and 3rd legs. It cannot go backwards.
