

Building Maintenance

Responsible for repairs and maintenance on building and grounds. Keeps abreast of the cleaning schedule, lawn service, HVAC maintenance, etc.

Building Rental

Contact person for other organizations (breed/ specialty clubs etc) who are interested in renting the Club building. Works with these groups on the contract and insurance for renting the building.

Bylaws

Responsible for the Constitution and Bylaws interpretation and any revisions or additions the club votes to do.

<u>CGC</u>

Schedules, finds volunteers, and attends the CGC, CGCA, CGCU and Trick Dog tests.

Commissary

Inventory and stock supplies as needed for refrigerator, kitchen and bathroom.

Database/Roster

Updates the master database with new members, attendance, dues. Creates roster for website. Supplies files and analytics as requested. Must also sit on the technology committee.

<u>Historian</u>

Collects articles, letters, photographs and newspaper clippings for inclusion in the Club scrapbook and website.

Legislative Liaison

Determine if there are new state legislation or local ordinances being changed or initiated. Review animal magazines and websites for any news items on animal legislation.

<u>Library</u>

Maintain Club library of books and DVDs. Reviews and recommends books and/or DVDs/CDs for library acquisition.

Printing

Assures continuity, quality and adequate supply of all Club printed materials.

Promotional/Community Events/Advertising

Schedules participation at community events to promote responsible dog ownership through dog training. Created all DTCDC advertising and promotional material to conform to current club logo and other current forms. Work with members to insure a consistent and identifiable presentation. Place advertisements in appropriate paces. Present DTCDC event information to the media. Continue to sponsor the regular obenience First Place Novice A at all Texas Kennel Club Obedience trials.

Purchasing

Purchases Club apparel, training equipment and supplies as they pertain to training.

Registration/Registrar

Responsible for reviewing the students and their dogs for each puppy and beginner class. Get and review all shot records. Make sure students have watched the registration video. Answer questions emailed to the club regarding classes. Manage Eventbrite. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Safety and Awareness

Review news, articles and science on COVID to help the board make intelligent decisions navigating COVID restrictions. Write a report for anyone that has had an accident at the club.

<u>Show 'n Go</u>

Responsible for scheduling SNG dates, volunteers to do run throughs, and stewards. Create and distribute announcement flyers. Oversee the day of SNG. Knowledge of Google Sheets is a plus.

<u>Social</u>

Plan and coordinate social gatherings for the club including a Summer Fun Day and December/Holiday Awards Celebration Banquet.

Social Media

Maintain a professional and business-like presence to promote DTCDC on current social media platforms. Knowledge of FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram, etc. required. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Sends appropriate cards and/or plants to members for illness, sympathy, celebration etc. Coordinate birthday gift "chances" at monthly meetings.

Technology

Manage and maintain the club's computer, Wi-Fi, VoIP, online registration, database, stereo/PA/projector & camera surveillance system. Responsible for setting up Zoom meetings for the board, general membership and committees.

Telephone

Return calls to prospective students, direct people to the website, and informs them how to register. Answers training questions asked by the public.

Therapy

Serves as a resource for club members to obtain information about the various types of therapy dog work and the various therapy dog organizations.

<u>Training</u>

Formulates training policies, fees, and enrollment requirements. Schedules classes, instructors and assistants. Develop and maintain class training procedures and manuals.

Treasury Review

Audits treasurers work when needed. Must have financial background.

<u>Wall</u>

Responsible for maintaining the interior walls of the club in a manner that positively reflects the accomplishments of the club and its members. Includes engraved wall plates as ordered by club members and assembly with supplied photo.

Website



You stare into his eyes and say, "Are you tired?" He smacks his lips and yawns, his great teeth revealing themselves, then disappearing again. "Yes, I know you're tired," you say and pat his head, "I am too." Your friends get the message.



Step 1:	Most dogs will yawn when they are anxious. You can use that to help you catch the yawn. Look for your dog to yawn when he wants to go outside or wants a ball or toy that you are holding. When he yawns, click and treat. Because this trick must be 'caught' with the clicker, it can be difficult, and you have to time your clicks exactly right.
Step 2:	When he starts to offer a yawn because he has been treated for it, go ahead, and give the command you want to associate with his action. It could be yawn, tired, or sleepy, but in any case, be consistent with your command. Repeat three to four times per session.
Step 3:	After several sessions of training your dog to yawn, give him the command and see if he will respond with a yawn.

OUR EXPERIENCE

Because we have to catch Caspian in the act of yawning, it can be frustrating when trying to get him to yawn multiple times in a training session. Caspian will lick his muzzle and yawn if he is anxious, so sometimes during our training session, we would turn around and not say anything for a few seconds. Caspian, not knowing what to do, would then get a little anxious. An assistant would either click or let the trainer know when to click if he yawned (you won't be able to see your dog if your back is turned). This trick was more frustrating for Caspian in general. He knew that he was being clicked and treated for something that had to do with his mouth but didn't quite understand at first. If your dog gets frustrated during a training session, cut back on the amount of time for each session, but always try to end on a high note.

TEACHING TROUBLE

My dog doesn't understand that he's being clicked for yawning. How can I fix this problem? Since a yawn is a natural response that a dog might give for either being tired or anxious, he usually doesn't even notice when he's doing it. Making him aware that he is yawning is the key to this trick. It may take several training sessions, but eventually your dog will get it!

Tip "This trick presents better if you use a cute command like "Are you sleepy?" or "It's bedtime."







Friday October 22nd, we celebrated the Advance class's successes at the recent UKC Nosework trial in Alvarado, October 15-17, 2021. It was harder to get the lady at the bakery to spell things correctly (top, left) than it was for any of our dogs to earn a qualifying run at the trail. There were still errors on it. It was supposed to have another C and say "students rock". Oh well!! (Middle, left) Congratulations to all (from left) Amy Quinn Schwartz (does mainly AKC with her ESS), Miriam Ingelhart, Sheryl Barker, Jean Robson, Ruth Miles, Vernon Miles and Robert Rodgers.

We did a couple different practice/training scenarios in class. Advance worked exteriors to train better alerts in an outside area where some dogs struggle with the environment and a second area with a food distraction to train off. Inside we did a different set up at the far end of the room to work the dogs searching a blank area and learning it is ok and rewarding a good search. All dogs were worked off leash to determine ability to work away from handler. Handler had to stay at the opening. Not one dog had an issue searching on their own and after checking the few items started back to their handler with a question type look at them. Not one dog alerted out of frustration as no handler was crowding them and making them think there must be something there. We rewarded blank searches. The handlers did not know there was a blank area. It was their first time to stay back, watch how their dog worked without them and start reading when their dog says there is nothing. Handlers witnessed their dogs not stressing to find something and how it is necessary to not crowd their dogs. This skill is needed in upper levels of trials for both UKC and AKC. The class did this blank exercise one-onone as they rotated in from outside so no clues were given by others.

Beginners had the items from outside in the inside search area. Not one beginner dog had an issue finding the three odors and giving their alerts voluntarily. We encouraged off leash, but the handler could be in the area just keeping a distance. These dogs all showed they know their job; it was a lesson to the handlers to stay back, don't assume and let the dog find and alert without handler pressure. We moved all the items around and they nailed it again. Dakota, Rex's smooth coat Collie, even catalogued the painted dumbbell on the wall painting and declared it neutral!

Was a win-win session for all. The beginner folks were cheering each partnership and clapping.




