## Building Maintenance

Responsible for repairs and maintenance on building and grounds. Keeps abreast of the cleaning schedule, lawn service, HVAC maintenance, etc.

## Building Rental

Contact person for other organizations (breed/ specialty clubs etc) who are interested in renting the Club building. Works with these groups on the contract and insurance for renting the building.

## Bylaws

Responsible for the Constitution and Bylaws interpretation and any revisions or additions the club votes to do.

## CGC

Schedules, finds volunteers, and attends the CGC, CGCA, CGCU and Trick Dog tests.

## Commissary

Inventory and stock supplies as needed for refrigerator, kitchen and bathroom.

## Database/Roster

Updates the master database with new members, attendance, dues. Creates roster for website. Supplies files and analytics as requested. Must also sit on the technology committee.

## Historian

Collects articles, letters, photographs and newspaper clippings for inclusion in the Club scrapbook and website.

## Legislative Liaison

Determine if there are new state legislation or local ordinances being changed or initiated. Review animal magazines and websites for any news items on animal legislation.

## Library

Maintain Club library of books and DVDs. Reviews and recommends books and/or DVDs/CDs for library acquisition.


## Membership \& Volunteerism

Develops and provides membership information to prospective Club members. Process new member paperwork and submits to the board for approval. Presents new members to the membership at a General Membership meeting for the vote. Promotes the involvement of new members in the club.

## PawPrint

Assemble, publish and distribute the Club's monthly newsletter. Gather articles and information from the club members.

## Printing

Assures continuity, quality and adequate supply of all Club printed materials.

## Promotional/Community Events/Advertising

Schedules participation at community events to promote responsible dog ownership through dog training. Created all DTCDC advertising and promotional material to conform to current club logo and other current forms. Work with members to insure a consistent and identifiable presentation. Place advertisements in appropriate paces. Present DTCDC event information to the media. Continue to sponsor the regular obenience First Place Novice A at all Texas Kennel Club Obedience trials.

## Purchasing

Purchases Club apparel, training equipment and supplies as they pertain to training.

## Registration/Registrar

Responsible for reviewing the students and their dogs for each puppy and beginner class. Get and review all shot records. Make sure students have watched the registration video. Answer questions emailed to the club regarding classes. Manage Eventbrite. Must also sit on the technology committee.

## Safety and Awareness

Review news, articles and science on COVID to help the board make intelligent decisions navigating COVID restrictions. Write a report for anyone that has had an accident at the club.

## Show 'n Go

Responsible for scheduling SNG dates, volunteers to do run throughs, and stewards. Create and distribute announcement flyers. Oversee the day of SNG. Knowledge of Google Sheets is a plus.

## Social

Plan and coordinate social gatherings for the club including a Summer Fun Day and December/Holiday Awards Celebration Banquet.

## Social Media

Maintain a professional and business-like presence to promote DTCDC on current social media platforms. Knowledge of FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram, etc. required. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Your dog learns to place his paw in your outstretched hand; like a handshake, but better.

## Steps

1. At your dog's level, hold a treat in a closed hand facing upwards.
2. Your dog will investigate, sniff, and eventually 'paw' at the hand. At this point of the trick say 'good.' Give them a food reward.
3. Repeat several times, and then present your hand without a food treat in. Reward at the point they place a paw on it.
4. Now say Paw, and simply hold your hand out flat. When your dog paws at it, say 'good." Reward again.
5. You can now incorporate holding their paw gently and shaking it.

The Weekend Dog, by Myrna M. Milani, D.V.M.


This book is an old one in our library collection, but it has so many wonderful ideas and helpful information that is still very practical in today's society. Milani is a practicing behavioral vet who is very interested in the human-animal relationship and has written several books on this topic. "The Weekend Dog" was written in response to dog behavioral issues that she was consulted on by people who dearly loved their dogs but were busy working outside of their homes (both partners) so the dogs were alone all day. The owners were coming home tired from a long workday and yet their dogs had been asleep all day and now wanted attention, exercise, mental stimulation and companionship. Or the owners came home to find some type of destructive behavior had occurred in their absences. How do you do the most you can with your dog for a short amount of time in the evenings and on the weekend only?
This book discusses types of dogs, types of humans, and how to make sure you pair yourself with a dog that will fit properly into your lifestyle. The majority of the book has lots of really wonderful ideas and helpful information about how to train your dog for general obedience and also for the alone time they have and the fun times together that you and your dog can experience on the weekends when you have the most time together. So don't judge a book by its age, as sometimes older books are overlooked because people think that means the book has outdated information. That can be true, but it is not the case with this one! This book covers so many helpful components of dog ownership and is well worth a read.

To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson, who determines which club members had the highest average Obedience and Rally scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

The Most Improved Obedience Score Award and Most Improved Rally Score Award are awarded to the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn an Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson, who determines which club members had the most improvement between scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR SCORES: Scores must be submitted via U.S. Mail or email to Lynda Holman BY NOVEMBER 15, 2022. Fill in the information on the Award Submission Form on the next page and send to Lynda. Use a separate form for each award for which you are submitting scores. Scores submitted are to be for each of the three legs required to earn the degree. 4th legs do not count.
