Most importantly, it's because of him, the Heishman family, found and joined DTCDC in 2010. Sparks is always willing to train and eager to please. Trick Dog is our favorite class and sport. Sparky loves showing off his tricks. And yes, you CAN teach an old dog a new trick. His latest is "talking". Not barking but exaggerated opening and closing his mouth, making sounds, often with inflection in response to being prompted. It's really cute!

Sparky is recognized as an AKC Achiever Dog with titles in Conformation, Canine Good Citizen, Rally, Trick Dog, and Herding. He also competed in Conformation with IABCA receiving recognition as International, National, & Honors Championship in Bronze.

Today, at 14 years old, Sparks is still active with our other two standard schnauzers. Happy for trips to the lake and to visit Krissy's farm. Always eager to explore new sights and smells.

So, back to the pic, in case you're curious, Sparks took Best of Breed that last time in the ring. He retired from Conformation with the AKC title of Bronze Grand Champion.

Homemade, Dog Treats

Salmon treats

(Sent in by Karen Henry)



Credit for these treats goes to the late Peggy Phelps. Many DTCDC members are familiar with these treats!

Ingredients:

- 1 large can of Salmon
- 4 eggs
- 2 sleeves graham crackers, crushed.

Instructions:

- 1. Drain salmon, and set liquid aside.
- 2. Combine everything then add the liquid back in.
- 3. Spread the mixture into a greased 9 x 13 pan, or use a jelly roll pan for thinner treats.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes for a soft treat, or a little longer for a more crunchy treat. You should be able to pinch off tiny bits of the softer version.
- 5. Cut into 1" squares when cooled. Store in refrigerator. You can freeze to save it. These treats are rich, so treat sparingly.

Training Treats

(Sent in by Karen Henry)



Ingredients:

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 4 oz. jar of baby food, flavor of your choice (if you use a meat, they usually come in a 2 1/2 oz. jar. Go ahead and use 2 jars)
- 1/2 cup of flour
- Water to thin to the consistency of thin pancake batter

Instructions:

- 1. This recipe will fill a Palsky silicone mold (mine makes 468 tiny treats!) You can find many sizes of molds on Amazon. I suggest placing the mold on a baking sheet for easier handling.
- 2. Bake at 300 degrees Fahrenheit for 35 minutes.
- 3. I then turn the oven off and allow it to cool before removing the treats from the mold.
- 4. Treats can be stored in the refrigerator for a few days, or you can store longer term in a good container in the freezer. My dogs love these!!



Liver Cake

(Sent in by Laura Lipscomb)



Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Ingredients

- 1 lb. liver (I use prepared beef liver already peeled/trimmed whatever else they can do to sanitize it (can you tell I'm not a fan?) - tried chicken livers but the dogs prefer beef
- 1 egg
- ¾ cup rolled oats (I use rolled oats but you can use flour or something else just as a binder)

Instructions

- 1. Put the liver and egg in a blender or food processor. Whizz until smooth.
- 2. I add the oats in the food processor to break them down a bit. Or... you can add the binder to the liver mixture in a bowl. Stir until well mixed.
- 3. Transfer to a lined baking tin.
- 4. Cook in a preheated oven for about 30 minutes.
- 5. Leave to cool and then slice up into bite sized treats

Important Information

- Tell your family that they are dog treats, not brownies! They look like brownies
- These treats smell awful while they bake so

- prepare to air out your house after.
- They freeze wonderfully I vacuum pack mine.
- I've never found a training treat more effective than this one for my dogs.

Dried Sweet Potato Chips

(Sent in by Shirley and John Worley)



Directions:

- Try to select sweet potatoes that are fairly uniform in size and shape to make slicing easier.
- Wash and dry several medium sized sweet potatoes.
- Carefully cut them into slices that are about 1/4" thick. Shake them (think saucing wings) in a bowl with a tablespoon or two of melted coconut oil. When the sweet potato slices are coated place them on racks for a dehydrator set to 125 degrees.
- Note: The oil is palatable for the dogs and it helps keep the sweet potatoes from turning dark during the drying process.

How long they take to dry depends on several factors:

- How thick they are
- The drying ability of your dehydrator
- How dry you want them to be crisp or chewy
- How much humidity is in the air

If you don't have a dehydrator you can cook/dry them in the oven. Put the slices on cooling



racks inside of a cookie sheet. Set the temperature for the lowest setting (of Bake) that is possible for your oven. Every hour rotate the pans in the oven. You should plan on the oven drying to take quite a while, especially if you want them to be more dehydrated.

If you want them to be of a chewy texture the sweet potato chips will need to be either frozen or stored for a short time in the refrigerator. These are great for teething puppies!

I usually go to a drier texture for a crunchy treat. That way I know that I can safely store them in large canning jars with tight fitting lids. Amber jars are best to restrict light degradation, but clear jars stored in a closet works well too.

Remember when storing dried foods the moisture level must be no more than 10%. The chips should feel tough to brittle. If you aren't sure if they are dry enough be safe and store them in the refrigerator or freezer.

My dogs also love zucchini chips made the same way!

Tuna Pumpkin Treats

(Sent in by Shirley and John Worley)



Ingredients

• 2 cans tuna (I usually use one can water pack and one can oil pack, but you can use whatever you have. If you use water pack only add a couple tablespoons of oil to the recipe. Canned

salmon is also great for this recipe and is even smellier!)

- 1/3 cup parmesan cheese, either shredded or grated will work but I use shredded
- 1 egg
- Scant ½ cup water
- About half small can of pumpkin. This should be about ¾ cup
- 3 tablespoons of powdered milk will add protein but don't use it if your dog can't tolerate lactose.
- 3 cups whole wheat flour, oat flour or brown rice flour. You can use all of either or a mixture. I usually use about half and half wheat with one of the other flours.
- You can also add a few shakes of something smelly like Worcestershire sauce. Just beware of adding too much salt and garlic or onion. I usually do not use it.

Directions

- 1. Use an electric mixer to break up and combine all ingredients except for the powdered milk and the flour.
- 2. Add the powdered milk and flour: stir with a spoon until combined. Mixture should be like a soft cookie dough but not too sticky. You can make adjustments by adding water or flour as needed.
- 3. I bake it in a large lipped baking sheet. Spray the sheet pan with cooking spray. Spread the mixture in the pan to about ¼ inch thick (I use my hands with a dusting of whole wheat flour to minimize sticking to my fingers). Use a pizza cutter to cut it into 1/4" to ½" pieces. Don't worry about separating the pieces now. They will break apart after baking.
- 4. Bake at 325 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes. They should be spongy but not really soft when done. Remove from the oven and allow to cool.
- 5. Break them into pieces and package in small zip bags and store in the freezer. These are like human food and will spoil if left in the refrigerator for more than a few days so I leave them in the freezer until needed. They do thaw quite quickly to be ready for use.

Makes about 7 cups of treats.

Homemade Dog Treats

3-Ingredient PB & Banana



Prep Time 10 minutes minutes Cook Time 10 minutes minutes Total Time 20 minutes

Ingredients

minutes

- 1 Banana preferably overripe
- ½ cup Natural Peanut Butter (no xylitol)
- 1 cup Old-Fashioned Oats

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. Mash an overripe banana in a medium-sized mixing bowl.
- 3. Add the Natural Peanut Butter and Old-Fashioned Oats. Mix.
- 4. Plop the mix on a sheet of parchment paper. Spread it out to your desired thickness. I recommend about 1/4".
- 5. Cut out in shapes of your choice.
- 6. Place on a prepared baking sheet.
- 7. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden.
- 8. Let cool completely before giving to your dog.

Notes

This recipe yields about 21 small dog treats. It will vary based on how big you cut your treats.



Cheesy Sweet Potato Chews



Ingredients

- ½ cup mashed Sweet Potato
- ½ cup grated Cheese
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan Cheese
- Pinch dried Basil
- ½ cup Flour

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and line a baking sheet with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat.
- 2. In a large bowl mix all ingredients one at a time, kneading well after each addition.
- 3. Once dough is well mixed roll dough into 1/2 inch balls and place them an inch apart onto the prepared baking sheet. Press down on the tops with a fork to flatten.
- 4. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes, turn off oven and allow to cool inside with door slightly open. Refrigerate.
- Makes 1 to 2 dozen rounds

Apple Cinnamon Cookie



Ingredients

- 1 cup applesauce
 - 1 egg
- ½ cup rolled oats
- ½ tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 cup flour

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Homemade Dog Treats

- 2. Combine flour, rolled oats and applesauce into a large bowl.
- 3. Beat egg in separate bowl, then slowly add to mixture.
- 4. Stir the mixture until it forms into a dough. Use more flour if needed.
- 5. Place small dollops of mixture onto baking sheet lined with cooking spray. The cookies can be placed close together, as the mixture doesn't expand much when cooked. Add optional beaten egg to the tops for color.
- 6. Bake for approximately 30 minutes or until they're crispy.
- 7. Remove from oven and allow to cool.

Recipe Note

While these crisps might not look appetizing to the human eye, your pup is sure to love them. Be sure to keep him away from the oven during baking time as the smell of cinnamon might draw him a little too close to the oven.

Chicken and Rice Balls



Ingredients:

1 cup wild or brown rice, cooked until very mushy

- 1 cup diced or shredded chicken
- 3 tablespoons rice flour
- 1 tablespoon diced parsley
- 1 egg
- unrefined extra virgin olive oil to grease muffin cups (if not using liners)

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350
- 2. combine all ingredients in a bowl and mix well
- 3. press mixture into balls and place in a greased, mini muffin cup
- 4. bake for 25 minutes or until golden brown
- cool completely before serving
- 6. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 3-5 days or freeze for later use.

Crispy Carrot Dog Biscuits



TIME 20 minutes

COOK TIME 15 minutes

TOTAL TIME 35 minutes

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup carrot purée (see step 2 below)
- 1/3 cup whole wheat flour
- 1/3 cup oat flour



- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 pinch cinnamon powder

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F/200°C.
- 2. Blend 2 carrots with 1/3 cup water. It doesn't have to be super smooth.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, combine the flours and cinnamon powder. Add the carrot purée and stir to combine with a large spoon, then use your hands to make a smooth dough. If it's too sticky add more all-purpose flour; if it's too crumbly add more water or carrot purée.
- 4. Roll out the dough on a floured parchment paper until it's approx. 1/2 inch (1-2 cm) thick. Cut out the cookies. Transfer the cookies onto a baking tray lined with parchment paper. Knead together the leftover dough, roll it out again, cut out cookies until you've used all the dough.
- 5. Bake the doggie biscuits for about 15 minutes until crispy! Let them cool off completely before giving them to your dog or filling them into an airtight container for storage.

Pumpkin Pupcakes



Servings: 10 pupcakes PREP: 10 MINUTES COOK: 25 MINUTES TOTAL: 35 MINUTES

Ingredients for Dog Cupcake Batter

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ¾ cup pumpkin puree
- ½ cup peanut butter, all-natural use natural, no sugar added, no xylitol
- 1 egg, beaten
- ½ cup vegetable oil plus more for cake pan

Ingredients for Dog Safe Frosting

- ½ cup greek yogurt
- ¼ cup peanut butter, all-natural

Instructions for Cupcakes

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, add baking soda into flour. Add remaining ingredients and mix until combined.
- 2. 1 cup flour, ½ teaspoon baking soda, ¾ cup pumpkin puree, ½ cup peanut butter, all-natural, 1 egg, beaten
- 3. Brush oil (1/8 cup vegetable oil) inside the cupcake tin, or use cupcake liners. Fill each cupcake half full with batter. Place in oven and bake 25 minutes or until done. Turning halfway through baking. Allow to cool thoroughly before frosting.

Instructions for Dog Safe Frosting

Mix yogurt and peanut butter until well combined. Frost pupcakes once cooled.

Notes

- Pumpkin pupcakes will keep for 4 to 5 days if placed in an airtight container in the refrigerator.
- Adjust the serving size according to your dog's weight.

Homemade Dog Treats

Blueberry Biscuits



Prep Time: 5 minutes Cook Time: 15 minutes

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp coconut oil
- 1 1/4 cup + 2 tbsp whole wheat flour
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup blueberries, halved

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F
- 2. Put coconut oil in a microwave safe bowl
- 3. Microwave 30 seconds until melted
- 4. Add 1 1/4 cup whole wheat flour, mix until fully combined
- 5. Add eggs 1 at a time
- 6. Fold in blueberries
- 7. Using your hands, form dough into a ball
- 8. Roll out dough on a floured surface, sprinkling dough with flour if it is sticking to rolling pin
- 9. Cut treats into shapes using cookie cutters
- 10. Place treats on on an oiled baking sheet
- 11. Bake for 15 minutes
- 12. Cool before giving to your pup!
- 13. Store in an air tight container up to 5 days or freeze for extended freshness



Salmon Crack



Ingredients

- 1 (14.75-ounce) can pink salmon
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 2 eggs

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Open a can of pink salmon. Don't drain. Put salmon and its juices into a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Crack and add two eggs. Dispose of shells. Flake the salmon and mix it with the eggs.
- 3. Take the flour and mix it into the salmon/egg mixture. You don't have to be precise with the flour and may add more or less than recommended. You will want a consistency similar to the photo below.
- 4. Spray a baking sheet with no-stick cooking spray and dump the dough mixture onto the sheet. Sprinkle some flour on top of the dough and flour your hands to keep the dough from sticking to your hands as you press it flat.
- 5. Press the dough out flat until it is about 1/4-inch thick. If you want it more moist, you can make it thicker. If you want it crunchier, you can make it thinner. You don't need to make perfect corners as this will later be broken into small treats. Just flatten it out into any old shape.
- 6. Place the cookie sheet in the center of the oven. Let it cook for 25 to 35 minutes, depending on whether you prefer moister treats or crunchier treats.

Homemade Dog Treats

- 7. Remove from the oven. Use a spatula to lift off the cookie sheet before cooling; otherwise, it may stick to your cookie sheet. You can let it cool on a rack or on the cookie sheet.
- 8. Once cooled, divide the Salmon Crack into desired portions, bag it, and then freeze it.

- 5. Place dough on flour dusted surface. Roll or press dough out to about 1/4" inch thick.
- 6. Use a small bone cookie cutter to cut out cookies.
- 7. Roll out leftover scraps and cut out as many as possible.
- 8. Put cut out cookies on a parchment lined baking sheet.
- 9. Bake for 14-16 minutes. Transfer to a cooling rack.

Coconut Oil Delights



Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup of peanut butter (watch for xylitol)
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 tablespoon of virgin coconut oil
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 cup all-purpose flour

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Whisk together peanut butter, honey, oil and chicken broth.
- 3. In a separate bowl, combine flours and oatmeal.
- 4. Mix dry ingredients into wet ingredients.

Liver Popsicles



Ingredients

- 1 pound chicken livers or beef liver
- 1 quart water

Instructions

- 1. Bring liver to a boil then reduce heat and simmer for 40 minutes.
- 2. Refrigerate broth; when chilled, skim off all fat and discard.
- 3. Pour broth into plastic containers and freeze until solid.





AKC's Trick Dog Titles

From the 1920's and 1940's when trick dogs such as Rin Tin Tin and Lassie won peoples' hearts, trick dog training has become one of the most exciting areas in dog training today.

The American Kennel Club began offering AKC Trick Dog as a title-earning sport in 2017. Since that time, AKC Trick Dog has become extremely popular with many different kinds of dog owners. Since the testing program was approved for the club shortly after the program started, many in the club have gotten their dogs titled as official trick dogs.

There are five AKC Trick Titles you and your dog can earn:

- **AKC Novice Trick Dog (TKN)** Your dog performs 10 skills from the Novice list. (see link to "Application" below for lists of skills). If a dog has a Canine Good Citizen (CGC) certificate or title on record at AKC, it can do 5 Novice tricks (CGC + 5) to earn the Novice title. See the list of tricks here.
- **AKC Intermediate Trick Dog (TKI)** Your dog must have the Novice title, plus perform 10 Intermediate tricks. See the list of tricks here.
- **AKC Advanced Trick Dog (TKA)** Your dog must have the Intermediate title, plus perform 10 tricks from the Advanced list. See the list of tricks here.
- **AKC Trick Dog Performer (TKP)** In this title, handlers perform a short routine with at least 10 tricks with at least 3 tricks using props. See the requirements here.
- AKC Trick Dog Elite Performer (TKE) In the highest level of Trick Dog, the Elite Performers perform a routine that has a story/script. At least 5 props are used. See the requirements here.

Trick Dog Title Info:

AKC Trick Dog titles are official AKC titles listed on the dog's title record.

The processing fee for each title is \$30. Multiple titles for the same dog can be sent in together, each one will be processed in succession after each previous title has been added and printed.

Dogs must have an AKC, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number to earn a title.

All dogs can get a number including purebreds and mixed breeds.

How To Earn AKC Trick Dog Titles

- 1. You can do in-person testing with an AKC Approved CGC Evaluator (we have many approved evaluators in the club.) Terri Schurr is the current chairman of the CGC Committee which oversees our testing program, she organizes periodic testing times at the club. Watch your email and the PawPrint to find out when the next testing is taking place. There are also classes offered every session to help you train your dog. The Title Application and Checklist for the particular title(s) you are applying for should be sent to AKC.
- 2. You can have your tricks tested virtually by an AKC Approved CGC Evaluator.


Tug



Difficulty: Easy

Prerequisite: Take It

Items Needed: Clicker, Treats



Tere is a fun trick that both Tyou and your dog will enjoy. Some breeds will naturally play tug with you, or with other dogs. Maybe your dog already knows how to play tug. But learning to tug on command (and alternatively giving on command) is good to know. This trick is used in movie production all the time, and is a staple for stunt dogs. They learn to tug a certain piece of cloth or rope, which can be affixed to actors (Fido saves Billy by pulling him out of the way of a speeding train, etc.). The give command is also useful apart from the tug

game itself. If your dog collects your things, such as socks or slippers, tell him to give instead of chasing him all over the house. But of course, playing tug is a great way to spend time with your dog and further builds the bond between human and dog.

Teaching Your Dog To Tug:

Step 1: Take a rope toy and offer it to the dog and say "take it." (Reward your dog with praise when he moves toward the rope toy.)



Step 2: When your dog takes it, gently shake and tug the rope toy to get the dog to hold and pull against the tugs.

Step 3: Click and Treat when your dog tugs back on the rope toy. Use "Tug" as your command. Keep repeating this until your dog will tug at it eagerly.

Teaching Your Dog To Give:

Step 1: With your dog pulling firmly on the rope, say "give" at the same time offering a treat. When he drops the rope toy, click and treat.

Step 2: Reinforce this trick by repeating four or five times per session. Pay special attention to the "give" command. This is important for your safety. Make sure that your dog will stop the game with the "give" command.

Step 3: Play tug several times a day. Each time you play the game make sure you use the commands

saying "take it" when you your dog takes the rope and "give" when you want him to release the rope.

OUR EXPERIENCE

Caspian was very eager to tug on a new rope toy. Since he is a labradoodle, he gets very excited about playing, whether it's with a ball, frisbee, or toy, so he began tugging on the rope toy naturally. Even though it was natural for him to play tug, we still wanted to teach the commands so that he could tug multiple objects.

TEACHING TROUBLE

My dog is so uninterested in this trick. How will I get him to start tugging at the toy? It will help if the toy you use to teach this trick is one of your dog's favorite toys, a new toy, or one that you bring out only for this occasion. Your dog will be interested if you are excited, and play it with him like a game. You can also tease him with it a bit before you begin to get him excited.







DID YOUR DOG EARN AN OBEDIENCE AND/OR RALLY TITLE DURING THE PERIOD NOVEMBER 15, 2022 TO NOVEMBER 14, 2023? If so, you may qualify for the following awards DTCDC will present at the annual Holiday Party and Awards Ceremony.

The <u>Highest Average Obedience Score Award and Highest Average Rally Score Award</u> are awarded to the club member achieving the highest average score on the three legs required to earn an Obedience Title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the highest average score on the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson</u>, who determines which club members had the highest average Obedience and Rally scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

The Most Improved Obedience Score Award and Most Improved Rally Score Award are awarded to the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn an Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson, who determines which club members had the most improvement between scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR SCORES: Scores must be submitted via U.S. Mail or email to Lynda Holman BY NOVEMBER 15, 2023. Fill in the information on the Award Submission Form on the next page and send to Lynda. Use a separate form for each award for which you are submitting scores. Scores submitted are to be for each of the three legs required to earn the degree. 4th legs do not count. The first 2 legs of the degree can be received at any prior time, but the 3rd leg that earned the degree must be received during the period November 15, 2022 to November 14, 2023. Highest Average is an average of the legs that earned the title. Most Improved must be points between 1st and 2nd, 2nd and 3rd, or 1st and 3rd legs. It cannot go backwards.
