Why did you agree to be on the 2022 DTCDC Board?



Building Maintenance

Responsible for repairs and maintenance on building and grounds. Keeps abreast of the cleaning schedule, lawn service, HVAC maintenance, etc.

Building Rental

Contact person for other organizations (breed/specialty clubs etc) who are interested in renting the Club building. Works with these groups on the contract and insurance for renting the building.

Bylaws

Responsible for the Constitution and Bylaws interpretation and any revisions or additions the club votes to do.

CGC

Schedules, finds volunteers, and attends the CGC, CGCA, CGCU and Trick Dog tests.

Commissary

Inventory and stock supplies as needed for refrigerator, kitchen and bathroom.

Database/Roster

Updates the master database with new members, attendance, dues. Creates roster for website. Supplies files and analytics as requested. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Historian

Collects articles, letters, photographs and newspaper clippings for inclusion in the Club scrapbook and website.

Legislative Liaison

Determine if there are new state legislation or local ordinances being changed or initiated. Review animal magazines and websites for any news items on animal legislation.

<u>Library</u>

Maintain Club library of books and DVDs. Reviews and recommends books and/or DVDs/CDs for library acquisition.



Membership & Volunteerism

Develops and provides membership information to prospective Club members. Process new member paperwork and submits to the board for approval. Presents new members to the membership at a General Membership meeting for the vote. Promotes the involvement of new members in the club.

PawPrint

Assemble, publish and distribute the Club's monthly newsletter. Gather articles and information from the club members.

Printing

Assures continuity, quality and adequate supply of all Club printed materials.

Promotional/Community Events/Advertising

Schedules participation at community events to promote responsible dog ownership through dog training. Created all DTCDC advertising and promotional material to conform to current club logo and other current forms. Work with members to insure a consistent and identifiable presentation. Place advertisements in appropriate paces. Present DTCDC event information to the media. Continue to sponsor the regular obenience First Place Novice A at all Texas Kennel Club Obedience trials.

Purchasing

Purchases Club apparel, training equipment and supplies as they pertain to training.

Registration/Registrar

Responsible for reviewing the students and their dogs for each puppy and beginner class. Get and review all shot records. Make sure students have watched the registration video. Answer questions emailed to the club regarding classes. Manage Eventbrite. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Safety and Awareness

Review news, articles and science on COVID to help the board make intelligent decisions navigating COVID restrictions. Write a report for anyone that has had an accident at the club.

Show 'n Go

Responsible for scheduling SNG dates, volunteers to do run throughs, and stewards. Create and distribute announcement flyers. Oversee the day of SNG. Knowledge of Google Sheets is a plus.

Social

Plan and coordinate social gatherings for the club including a Summer Fun Day and December/Holiday Awards Celebration Banquet.

Social Media

Maintain a professional and business-like presence to promote DTCDC on current social media platforms. Knowledge of FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram, etc. required. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Sunshine

Sends appropriate cards and/or plants to members for illness, sympathy, celebration etc. Coordinate birthday gift "chances" at monthly meetings.

Technology

Manage and maintain the club's computer, Wi-Fi, VoIP, online registration, database, stereo/PA/projector & camera surveillance system. Responsible for setting up Zoom meetings for the board, general membership and committees.

Telephone

Return calls to prospective students, direct people to the website, and informs them how to register. Answers training questions asked by the public.

Therapy

Serves as a resource for club members to obtain information about the various types of therapy dog work and the various therapy dog organizations.

Training

Formulates training policies, fees, and enrollment requirements. Schedules classes, instructors and assistants. Develop and maintain class training procedures and manuals.

Treasury Review

Audits treasurers work when needed. Must have financial background.

Wall

Responsible for maintaining the interior walls of the club in a manner that positively reflects the accomplishments of the club and its members. Includes engraved wall plates as ordered by club members and assembly with supplied photo.

Website

Maintain the Club website and internal membership email list. Required to sit on the technology committee.



I went to her class and considered it a total disaster, with my un-help, Miko did not do anything Sally told us to do and that all the other puppies did. I blamed the dog club and Sally and went to a class at Houn'

House where we did not do well either.

Then I decided I would rather come back to the club than drive thru the entire metroplex to a class at Houn' House. I also remembered how kind Sally had been and how giving of her time and expertise. So, I came back - and as they say - the rest is history. Sally was ever so patient with me and got me over many dog training hurdles though out the years.

I was always so very impressed at her dedication to the Dog Training Club of Dallas County and the mission of helping our students keep their unruly dogs - rather than taking them to the Dog Pound - through teaching the owners basic dog obedience principles. Our club was founded in order to help people like me – little knowledge and no dog sense at all, to be able to keep

Sally has been a Club member since October 1979 but was involved with the creation of our Club through her daughter Kelly, one of the club's charter junior members.

From the beginning to the present, Sally's consistent loving and nurturing leadership has benefited the Club through the positions she has held, the classes she has taught, the trainer she has nurtured, developed and

encouraged (many of them becoming DTCDC Instructors), the community education programs she has developed -- including leading us in drill teams, square dancing dogs, scent hurdle racing, introducing the Club to flyball and so much more.

Sally has the heart and the mind of an educator. She has helped the Club to continually improve itself by encouraging us to read, to go to seminars, to open our minds to alternative training styles and always to strive for excellence. Sally was the driving force behind our two training manuals and her husband,

The awards presentation was made to Sally on the Club's behalf by several members, who each discussed a particular aspect of the impact Sally has had on the Club's development and success. The presenters and their topics were:

Stella Moore: Introduction and Closing Comments
Maurine Pearson: Sally's Nurturing of Junior Handlers

Ruth Robinson: Sally's Past Awards

Grace Robinson: Sally's Leadership and Creativity

Lynda Holman: Sally's History with the Club

Award Presentation

After the presentation, Sally graciously thanked the Club for the award and honorary membership. We all stood and clapped for this great lady who has been the Club's friend in every possible way from the very beginning.

The history behind the awards: Earlier this year several members of the Training Committee were discussing the annual Club appreciation awards and the conversation kept circling back to Sally. Our Club Historian, Lynda Holman, started to go back over the Club historical records and the picture that came bursting forth was all that Sally had done for our Club. We talked about it and then took the idea of an unprecedented award for Sally to the Board of Directors. Toni and the members of the board listened patiently to the rationale for this suggestion and there was careful consideration regarding expenses. After cost and other information was gathered and presented at two board meetings, the board enthusiastically embraced the idea of a unique honor for someone who has made a unique contribution. members and their dogs earned their CD titles. Six of those were Junior Members. Dottie Walsleben, who was only 9 or 10 years old at the time along with her Sheltie, Scooter, were the very first to earn their title. The other Jr. Members were Kelly Browning (Henager) and her Sheltie Junior. Tim and Robert Walsleben and Shelties, Hamms and Belle, Katie Blute and German Shepherd, Dixiebel and Katie Miser and Risa her Sheltie.

Among the Adult members who earned CD's that year were Ruth Robinson and Domino her Miniature Poodle, Grace Robinson and Natasha her Samoyed, Lynda Walker Holman and Marquis her miniature Poodle and Norma Walker with Jean-Paul the Miniature Poodle.

Need a new trick to teach your dog?

Teach Your Dog To Limp

Difficulty: Hard **Prerequisite**: None

Items Needed: Clicker, Treats, Leash

This very well may be one of the hardest tricks to teach your dog, and is one many movie dogs learn and act out on the silver screen. Next to Jump Rope and Bang, it doesn't get much

harder than this. Although teaching this trick can be frustrating at times, it is a momentous achievement once your dog learns it, and can bring joy and laughter to you and your family; not to mention guests and friends.

Step 1: Hook up your dog's leash to his collar and use it to pull his front dominant paw up - be very careful as you walk with him - click and treat when he walks one or two steps.

Step 2: Keep doing this until he is successfully 'Limping' with the help of the leash.

Step 3: Try to encourage your dog to put less weight on his lifted paw. Over time use less and less force on the leash, and he will be able to limp on his own.

OUR EXPERIENCE

Teaching your dog to limp can be frustrating at times. It takes a lot of work, many training sessions, a whole bag full of treats, and many many hours. But it was well worth it. After teaching your dog this trick you can combine it with Crawl and Play Dead to give your guests a thrilling death scene.

I started out by attaching his leash to his collar, and using it to support his paw, keeping it in the air. Then I held my clicker away, motioning him to walk to it. I clicked and treated as soon as he made a couple of steps forward. The downside to supporting his paw in this way, is that it may condition him to put more weight on that paw; the opposite of what you want. There are other methods you can try, such as putting a sock on the paw: usually dogs will try and raise that paw, feeling the unbalance. Whichever method you use, be consistent, but don't feel like you can't try new things if your dog just isn't getting it. When teaching this trick, keep in mind that teaching your dog to limp on command is one of the hardest things to do, so be patient, be consistent, and vary the reward.

TEACHING TROUBLE

He won't transition into lifting his paw on his own!

It may take a long time for your dog to understand what he needs to do. It takes a long time of determined work to get this trick, even if you have a smart dog. Keep working with him until he gets it right!

Tip: "Be patient! This trick can take months to perfect; don't rush it. Dogs learning this trick need several breaks because of the stress you're putting on his mind and body."
