Building Maintenance

Responsible for repairs and maintenance on building and grounds. Keeps abreast of the cleaning schedule, lawn service, HVAC maintenance, etc.

Building Rental

Contact person for other organizations (breed/ specialty clubs etc) who are interested in renting the Club building. Works with these groups on the contract and insurance for renting the building.

<u>Bylaws</u>

Responsible for the Constitution and Bylaws interpretation and any revisions or additions the club votes to do.

<u>CGC</u>

Schedules, finds volunteers, and attends the CGC, CGCA, CGCU and Trick Dog tests.

Commissary

Inventory and stock supplies as needed for refrigerator, kitchen and bathroom.

Database/Roster

Updates the master database with new members, attendance, dues. Creates roster for website. Supplies files and analytics as requested. Must also sit on the technology committee.

<u>Historian</u>

Collects articles, letters, photographs and newspaper clippings for inclusion in the Club scrapbook and website.

Legislative Liaison

Determine if there are new state legislation or local ordinances being changed or initiated. Review animal magazines and websites for any news items on animal legislation.

<u>Library</u>

Maintain Club library of books and DVDs. Reviews and recommends books and/or DVDs/CDs for library acquisition.





Membership & Volunteerism

Develops and provides membership information to prospective Club members. Process new member paperwork and submits to the board for approval. Presents new members to the membership at a General Membership meeting for the vote. Promotes the involvement of new members in the club.

PawPrint

Assemble, publish and distribute the Club's monthly newsletter. Gather articles and information from the club members.

Printing

Assures continuity, quality and adequate supply of all Club printed materials.

Promotional/Community Events/Advertising

Schedules participation at community events to promote responsible dog ownership through dog training. Created all DTCDC advertising and promotional material to conform to current club logo and other current forms. Work with members to insure a consistent and identifiable presentation. Place advertisements in appropriate paces. Present DTCDC event information to the media. Continue to sponsor the regular obenience First Place Novice A at all Texas Kennel Club Obedience trials.

Purchasing

Purchases Club apparel, training equipment and supplies as they pertain to training.

Registration/Registrar

Responsible for reviewing the students and their dogs for each puppy and beginner class. Get and review all shot records. Make sure students have watched the registration video. Answer questions emailed to the club regarding classes. Manage Eventbrite. Must also sit on the technology committee.

Safety and Awareness

Review news, articles and science on COVID to help the board make intelligent decisions navigating COVID restrictions. Write a report for anyone that has had an accident at the club.

Show 'n Go

Responsible for scheduling SNG dates, volunteers to do run throughs, and stewards. Create and distribute announcement flyers. Oversee the day of SNG. Knowledge of Google Sheets is a plus.

<u>Social</u>

Plan and coordinate social gatherings for the club including a Summer Fun Day and December/Holiday Awards Celebration Banquet.

Social Media

Maintain a professional and business-like presence to promote DTCDC on current social media platforms. Knowledge of FaceBook, Twitter, Instagram, etc. required. Required to sit on the technology committee.

Sunshine

Sends appropriate cards and/or plants to members for illness, sympathy, celebration etc. Coordinate birthday gift "chances" at monthly meetings.

Technology

Manage and maintain the club's computer, Wi-Fi, VoIP, online registration, database, stereo/PA/projector & camera surveillance system. Responsible for setting up Zoom meetings for the board, general membership and committees.

Telephone

Return calls to prospective students, direct people to the website, and informs them how to register. Answers training questions asked by the public.

Therapy

Serves as a resource for club members to obtain information about the various types of therapy dog work and the various therapy dog organizations.

<u>Training</u>

Formulates training policies, fees, and enrollment requirements. Schedules classes, instructors and assistants. Develop and maintain class training procedures and manuals.

Treasury Review

Audits treasurers work when needed. Must have financial background.

<u>Wall</u>

Responsible for maintaining the interior walls of the club in a manner that positively reflects the accomplishments of the club and its members. Includes engraved wall plates as ordered by club members and assembly with supplied photo.

<u>Website</u>

Maintain the Club website and internal membership email list. Required to sit on the technology committee.



Need a new trick to teach your dog?

Several of us have recently added a new pup to our household. Here's a refresher on how to make teaching the pup's name a fun, effective experience! This trick is from mydogsname.com. Happy training!

5 Easy Steps to Teach a Dog Its Name

- Get some small treats and put your dog on a leash in a location without any distractions.
- Say your puppy's name in a clear, happy, excited voice.
- As soon as they look at you, say "yes" and give them a treat.
- Wait until they look away and then repeat the process 3-5 times.
- Play this name game several times a day and soon they'll know and love responding to their name!

Tips To Help Your Dog Learn Its Name

- Make your dog's name a positive thing Positive reinforcement is key to training dogs. If it associates its name with good things it'll learn to listen for it. If you do have to scold your dog don't use its name. Try just a "No" instead of "Sparky NO".
- **Treat selection** You can use any treat that your dog likes, but it's a good idea to break them into smaller pieces as you'll be using a lot. These Zuke's mini treats are totally perfect for training.
- **Don't overuse their name** Keep in mind, you shouldn't use your dog's name so casually that it becomes background noise. Always make sure you have a reason to say it (which is to get their attention). Once you have their attention you can give commands without their name.
- **Vary the setting** Once your dog starts to master their name try switching up the location. If they're still doing great with that try removing the leash (if they're still in a safe area) or adding some distractions.
- Are the treats distracting? Our pup is food obsessed. If your dog is just staring at you all the time because you have treats it can be helpful to get one a treat pouch that keeps your hands free and lets you carry treats around without being so obvious that you're about to hand one out.
- Use a consistent name You might be able to get away with name variations eventually but you should train them with the same name every time. For example, if your dog's name is "Maggie", stick with that for now instead of saying 'Mags'.
- **Keep Training Short** Dogs will get bored of training if you do it too long and this just makes things harder. It's better to only do this a handful of times and stop before they get bored so the training stays interesting and fun.

An important note: Situations will arise where getting your dog's attention is critical, say if they're wandering into oncoming traffic or starting to eat a hazardous chemical. In these moments, you need your dog to recognize their name immediately so this training is really important. And don't let your dog off the leash before you know they'll respond to their name and return.






TERRI CLARY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Raiden competed on November 19-20 at the UKC Nosework trials at The Depot at Cleburne Station. Her goal was to acquire her Elite Champion Title and MHDX Title before the end of 2022. In Saturday's trial in Exterior Elite we came away with a 4th place win and another 4th place in Vehicle Elite to earn her title. In the vehicle search Raiden was presented with the Judges Team Award. This is a nice medallion.

This venue was the biggest indoor and outdoor search experience for Raiden. She searched locker



rooms, bathrooms, narrow hallways, and baseball equipment. Vehicle and Exterior elements included trains. On Saturday Raiden qualified in 6 elements. Two 1st place wins in Container and Interior Master. Three 4th place wins in Interior Elite and Vehicle Elite at both trials.

On Saturday she also qualified in HD Master. This leg finished her Master Handler Discrimination Excellent Title (MHDX). On Sunday she qualified in 5 of 6 element runs with a 2nd place win in Interior Master and Vehicle Master. In Exterior Master she earned a 3rd place win. Raiden has reached two major goals in UKC nosework. Raiden had a great experience competing in the sport she loves.

Georgann Hughes brags:



Swish and I traveled to beautiful Marble Falls, TX, for a new type of Scentwork venue for us. NACSW (National Association of Canine Scent Work) actually precedes UKC and AKC in holding Scentwork/Nosework trials for civilian dogs and owners. There haven't been very many trials with this organized in our area until fairly recently.

To earn the first full novice level title, NW1, the dog and handler must qualify in all 4 elements (Interior, Exterior, Containers and Vehicles) in the same trial and we were able to accomplish that. You'd think that with an experienced dog that it would be super easy, but not necessarily. The search areas are what we might encounter at any park or indoor area with normal everyday type smells and distractions, as opposed to the more pristine areas in other trials. Good girl, Swish!

The location was Camp of the Hills outside of town and just off of the Colorado River. Interior search was in a cabin bunk room and narrow bathroom - not an easy setting for Swish, but she passed! Other areas were outside and around the campground.

Another difference is that in other venues, the first level searches only use birch as the scent for all elements. In NASCW, any of the 3 scents (birch, anise, clove) used for all levels can be used. The "easy" part is that there's only one scent hidden in each element.

No placements, but there were 46 dogs entered, many younger and faster than Swish, but she's deliberate and keeps working for me. I'm very proud of my 9-year-old girl!!

Jan Hitchborn brags:



She got the two vehicles - a train car and all -with a 2nd and 3rd and then a 1st in elite exterior



one trial again with a full railroad car. One exterior to go! Skye has also been picking up championship legs, but we focused on these four this weekend. Logan was entered in superior and master runs to get closer to his Grand Nosework Championship for Superior and Master.
