Grace also stated that new instructors were needed for Wednesday night classes. Anyone that is able, should also consider apprenticing one of the new classes. Lucille reported that the YMCA in Waxahacie, Texas had contacted her regarding an Obedience class which they would like to begin later in the spring. The gentleman will contact her nearer the time for the class to begin. Lucille also announced that new leashes are available to club members in a rainbow of colors.

The b&ilding committee reported that plumbing and duct work need to be done. Mostof the expenses for the new building are paid for. Lucille reported that insurance would be obtained as soon as the state had rated the building.

The President announced that due to the resignation of Barry Rutherford as Secretary, Ruth Robinson was acting in that capacity until the office can be filled. The President quoted from the by-laws regarding the filling of vacancies and announced that the Board presented Gecelia Stevens as nominee. Notices had been prepared for the membership for a Special Meeting on Thursday, March 11th.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected to read that the Beginner classes had been split. Minutes were approved as corrected. The acting Secretary read applications for membership by Larry Dale Hebert and Michael R. Goodson. Ruth Robinson moved that these be accepted. Motion was seconded and carried. The question of unexcused absences from the meetings was raised and the new secretary will notify those members whose status is in jeopardy either by attendance or failure to pay dues on time.

Maurine Leffingwell, Treasurer, reported a balance on hand February 1, 1976, of \$378.82. Receipts plus check book correction for February totalled \$735.02 and disbursements were \$527.21, leaving a balance on hand February 29, 1976 of \$596.63.

Katic Blute, Commissary Chairman, reported that the commissary is doing well and she thanked everyone for their help and suggestions. Katic said that the payment of \$25.00 per month on the Micro-wave oven could be handled from the receipts. She announced that the refreshment chairman would be calling upon members in future months to furnish refreshments for the monthly meetings. Discussion of the possibility of obtaining cold drinks direct from the bottlers was held and this will be investigated.

The resignation of Ron Petty was announced and Katie Meiser volunteered to fill the vacancy as Fun Match Chairman. Grace Robinson reported on the Fun Match held February 29th at the training site. There were 21 entries, and the club cleared \$18.50. The ring set—up proved adequate for matches as arranged.

The Training Director reported that the split classes of Beginners would graduate Monday and Wednesday nights. Beginner Class #3, taught by Maurine Leffingwell, registered ten dogs and two member's dogs on Feb. 10th, and Puppy Class #2, taught by Ruth Robinson, registered twelve puppies on Feb. 11th. The new Beginner Class will start March 15th and the Puppy Class March 22nd. Teachers and apprentices are needed for future classes. Cloria Nelson informed the club that apprentices are greatly appreciated by the trainees and she had received compliments on this in her class. She also noted that all seven who are graduating from her class intend to continue into Novice class.

Lucile Tufte, Building Management Chairman, reported that the building has only a few major installations left to complete but there are several finishing touches to be done. The building fund is exhausted now but she was pleased to report that when everything is finished, we will have exceded the estimate by only about \$100.00 Lucile announced that there are still chairs at \$5.00 each which have no name on them. Furnishings still needed are filing cabinets and tables of all kinds. Cleanup work on the outside with planters included will be scheduled for a pretty Sunday in late March or early April with a picnic style lunch suggested.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Carolyn Cranford was named Trophy Chairman. The urgent need for a mimeograph machine was discussed. Lynda Walker had priced a good used one and found a machine priced at \$250.00. Crace moved that Lynda be empowered to make arrangement for the purchase of the machine. Motion was seconded and carried. Lynda showed the Club Letter, priced at \$2.50, and the C.D. and Obedience decals available to all those interested. Lucile extended the club's congratulations to Kelly Browning for the first place score of 197 at the Tri-Cities Fun Match, taking 1st place trophies in Novice B, Mighest Scoring Working Dog, and Mighest Scoring Dog in Match. Kelly also took a fourth place in Wichita Falls, earning a second led on Chelsea.

Helen Cariotis, new Mistorian and Resources and Publications Chairman, had questions about a library. It was suggested that she formulate plans for a lending library and members were urged to lend their books to this project. Katie Meiser said that it might be possible to obtain books on dogs through her mother's place of business.

The program was a presentation of a report and a quiz from the A.K.C. Obedience Judging Seminar by Katie Blute and Grace and Ruth Robinson.
