MINUTES OF THE D.T.C.D.C. BOARD MEETING March 18, 1986

Present: David Taylor

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:41 p.m. by the President, Judy Harmon.

Reading of the Minutes: No Minutes were read.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE: Chris will have everything set up for clean up day on May 31st.



THE SPORT OF DOG OBEDIENCE

Presented by the Dog Training Club of Dallas County

In the Sport of Obedience, the team of a Dog and its Handler, is required to progress through several levels of competency. The purpose of the Sport is to demonstrate the usefulness of the pure-bred or mixed-bred Dog as a companion of man and as being trained and conditioned always to behave in the home, in public places, and in the presence of other dogs. It is also required that the Dog demonstrate willingness and enjoyment of its work, and that the Handler move naturally and smoothly while working the Dog. The American Kennel Club, along with other clubs throughout the world, sponsors Obedience Trials that test the capabilities of the Pure-Bred Dog/Handler Teams. A qualifying score of 170 out of 200 points must be obtained under three separate judges in order to a Dog to earn a title. The AKC recognizes four titles in the Sport and each will be discussed below.

LEVEL 1: Basic Dog Obedience for the Pet Owner (Mixed- and Pure-Bred Dogs)

This level of Obedience can be taught to any Dog from 8 weeks old on up. At this level the Handler and Dog attend training classes together and the Handler is taught ways to teach his Dog acceptable behavior and the Dog begins to learn that his Handler will be shaping his behavior into new patterns. A relationship and bonding of mutual trust, respect, and love begins to take effect between the two. The Dog responds to the Handler as a result of this relationship and the praise he receives when doing what the Handler expects of him. In turn, the Handler assumes full responsibility for the care and development of the Dog as a life-long companion. By the completion of this level, the Dog should be walking at the Handler's side in a controlled manner while on leash and in a variety of situations such as at the Park, soccer games, etc., sitting when the Handler stops walking, standing still while being examined by a stranger such as a vet or groomer, and coming when called. In addition, the Dog should remain in a sitting or down position for an extended length of time while the Handler is moving around the room or yard away from the dog. For many people this is all they want from an Obedience class and from their dog. However, some people begin to see Obedience as a Hobby and move on to the more advanced levels and into AKC Obedience Trials.

LEVEL 2: Obedience as a Hobby and Sport (The AKC titles are awarded to Pure-Bred Dogs only. A Mixed-Breed can obtain titles through the All-American Dog program.)

Novice Level:

At this level the Dog and Handler are required to do a heeling pattern that includes right, left, and about turns, fast, slow, and halts. They are required to do the pattern two times: once on leash and once off leash. They will also do a Figure 8 pattern, a stand for examination, and a long recall. As a group, the Novice class will sit their dogs for 1 minute and down their dogs for 3 minutes while the Handler stands across the ring from the dogs. After three qualifying scores (minumum of 170 points out of a possible 200 points) under three different judges, the Dog will be awarded the title of Companion Dog (C.D.) by the AKC.

Open Level:

At this level all the work is done with the Dog off-leash. The team will do a heeling pattern, figure 8, and recall like the Novice level, but will also be required to down the dog while it is moving toward the Handler on the recall. In addition, the Dog is required to pick up a wooden dumbbell and bring it back to its Handler--it will do this over a high jump as well. The height of the high jump is usually 1-1/2 times the height of the Dog. The Dog will also jump a broad jump on command of the Handler. The length of the broad jump is 2 times the height of the high jump. Upon three qualifying scores, the Dog will be awarded the title of Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.).

Utility Level:

Once again, all work is done off-leash and the heeling exercise is all done on signals, with no voice commands at all. The Dog will stand, sit, and down on signals as well. In addition, the Dog is required to find a leather and metal dumbbell that his Handler has touched out of group of dumbbells. The dog will also pick up one glove out of three that the Handler tells him to pick up. The dog will, on command, leave the Handler's side and keep on running until the Handler tells him to sit. The dog will then jump over a high jump and a bar jump as directed by the Handler. After three qualifying scores, the Dog will be awarded the title of Utility Dog (U.D.).

Obedience Trial Championship

After a dog has completed the Open and Utility levels, he may go back and begin to accumulate points toward the Obedience Trial Championship (O.T.Ch.). To earn this title, a Dog is required to earn 100 points by finishing 1st or 2nd in the Open and Utility competitions. The points are awarded depending on the number of dogs in the competition. This is the highest level awarded to an Obedience Dog.

Tracking Dog and Tracking Dog Excellent

In earning these titles a Dog will demonstrate its ability to recognize and follow human scent while overcoming a series of typical scenting problems and locate objects dropped by the person whose track is being followed. To earn these titles, the Dog must follow two tracks and be subsequently certified by two separate judges.

In addition to these Titles, there are other competitions and Title awards given by many of the different breed clubs. These might include Water Titles, Shooting Titles, Herding Titles, and any other titles that prove the capability of a pure-bred dog to do the work his breed was originally bred to do.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR POSTING A PICTURE

As Of November 4, 1986

- I. A picture will be posted of those present members who have titled dogs (living or deceased) and for those dogs that earn titles and have been trained through D.T.C.D.C. You must be a Club Member when you earn the third leg of a title for the dog's picture to be posted.
- 2. The picture would measure 5 X 7, with the member furnishing any type of picture they wish that is not obscene.
- 3. The plates will include the call name of the dog, obedience title (eg. C.D.; C.D.X.; U.D.; O.T.C.H.; All-American titles), date title earned and any other honors the dog may be entitled to that the member wishes to have posted.
- 4. Placement of a picture will be retroactive to all current club members who have had dogs to earn titles whether living or dead, as long as they were a member of the Club at the time they earned or finished their degree.
- The Club will supply the frame, the member supply the picture and pay for the engraving of the plate(s).

PROCEDURE FOR POSTING A PICTURE

- 1. When a title is earned, fill out an Order Form, identifying the plate(s) you wish to have engraved. Take the Order Form to Discount Trophy located across Hwy 67 from the Club (522 Hwy 67 at Danieldale Exit, 298-7957) and place your order for engraving the plate(s). You are responsible for payment. Discount Trophy will engrave the plate, drill the holes in it, and supply some little rings to attach the plate to the frame.

Having the locks and deadbolts changed and methods of key check-ins were discussed and Pam volunteered to look into the expense.


Requirements to sustain membership were discussed.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR POSTING A PICTURE

As Amended on November 4, 1986

- 1. A picture will be posted of those present members who have titled dogs (living or deceased) and for those dogs that earn titles and have been trained through D.T.C.D.C. You must be a Club Member when you earn the third leg of a title for the dog's picture to be posted.
- 2. The picture would measure 5×7 , with the member furnishing any type of picture they wish that is not obscene.
- 3. The plates will include the call name of the dog, obedience title (eg. C.D.; C.D.X.; U.D.; O.T.C.H.; All-American titles), date title earned and any other honors the dog may be entitled to that the member wishes to have posted.
- 4. Placement of a picture will be retroactive to all club members who have had dogs to earn titles whether living or dead, as long as they were a member of the Club at the time they earned or finished their degree.
- 5. The Club will supply the frame, the member supply the picture and pay for the engraving of the plate(s).

PROCEDURE FOR POSTING A PICTURE

- 1. When a title is earned, fill out an Order Form, identifying the plate(s) you wish to have engraved. Take the Order Form to Discount Trophy located across Hwy 67 from the Club (522 Hwy 67 at Danieldale Exit, 298-7957) and place your order for engraving the plate(s). You are responsible for payment. Discount Trophy will engrave the plate, drill the holes in it, and supply some little rings to attach the plate to the frame.
- 2. The frames are stocked in the Supply Room. You will also need 2 brass screweyes, also located in the Supply Room. Put the screws into the bottom of the frame and attach the plates, by their rings, to the screws.
- 3. The finished product may be hung on the appropriate wall in the Club house.
